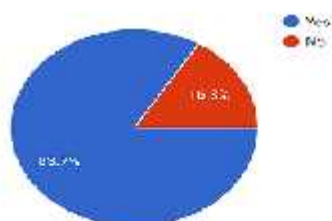

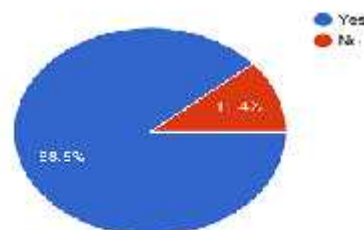
ARTS FACULTY: ACADEMIC YEAR 2016-17

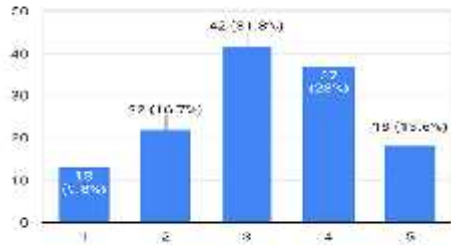

Annexure 18: Best Practices

Best Practice 1

Title of the Practice : SKILL CYCLE

Context: Jai Hind has abundant talent. Jai Hind students and teachers like to share and learn from one another. An urgent need to promote and enhance talents like music dance and photography in a non-competitive mode was felt.

The Practice:

Skill Cycle includes cells like Music Café, Jai Hind Dance Association and Jai Hind photography club which have been started with the objective of training students , teachers and nonteaching in various skills like music dance and photography. The trainers are experienced students and teachers. Education about music dance and photography was

imparted through workshops, seminars, and lectures. A space was created to express talent relax and get some exercise. The music Café was helmed by Dr. Varalakshmi . The Jai Hind Dance Association and Photography club were managed by Dr. Archana Ashtekar .

Evidence of Success:

A range of student talent was showcased in areas such as vocal music instrumental music at the inaugural event of the music café. Students from Khalsa college and Sophia college were also part of the sessions leading to a collaboration.

The photography club blurred out all the boundaries between committees and set a record by working with all major events. The Dance club trained more than 50 participants who enjoyed and learnt at the same time.

Problems:

Space to organize training , making time after lectures and devote to the learning process, and coordinating the students from various faculty are some of the problems encountered .

The Future:

The future is very exciting since there is an overwhelming response and the joy of learning sharing and performing is the hall mark of the Jai Hind College.

Best Practice 2

Title of Practice: Seamless ICT

The context: Jai Hind college has a strong investment in ICT. Teachers and students are eager to learn and use ICT in a more comprehensive fashion.

The practise: To give the much needed push to integrate ICT into teaching learning in a seamless manner many actions were taken.

TAF organised a Moodle workshop. Wilson Rao and Ummehani of the computer science department were the resource persons. The institution has a Moodle server configured for the college. The faculty were given an overview of how to use the service and its potential for teaching. Teachers were given hands on training. Teachers went through a rigorous one day program.

Wifi was made available in both buildings and all classrooms. Real time internet access to bring the resources available on the net into classroom teaching was made possible.

The library and reading room introduced the digital ink competition for 3 categories short story poetry and book review. NLIST is available through remote access with personalised user id and password to the library members. Question papers, lecture notes, reference material and college magazine are available on the E library.

Evidence of success: the MOODLE workshop had as many as 30 teachers eagerly leaning to use MOODLE. Teachers and students regularly access wifi to use for reading referencing and class room activities. The response to the digital ink competition was excellent with as many as 40 entries. Students and teachers use the e library for reference and exam preparation

Problems encountered: Nature of syllabus and pressure of syllabus size do not lend themselves to complete ICT integration. Students and teachers find it difficult to rely only on digital resources since there is the issue of quality of online resources. Power points are useful but are limited in terms of use and scope. The time taken to develop course content and evaluation with Moodle offsets its utility in theory based courses.

Future: More training for teachers in the following years will encourage them to use ICT in a systematic and effective manner. Syllabus modifications may be needed to adapt to ICT. Wi-Fi capacity needs to be improved. Library has to continuously digitise.
