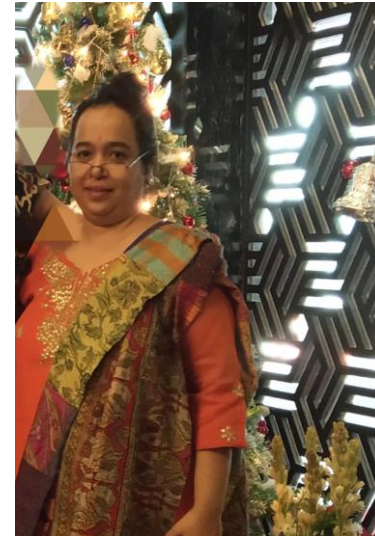

DEVELOPMENTAL PSYCHOLOGY - Pearson

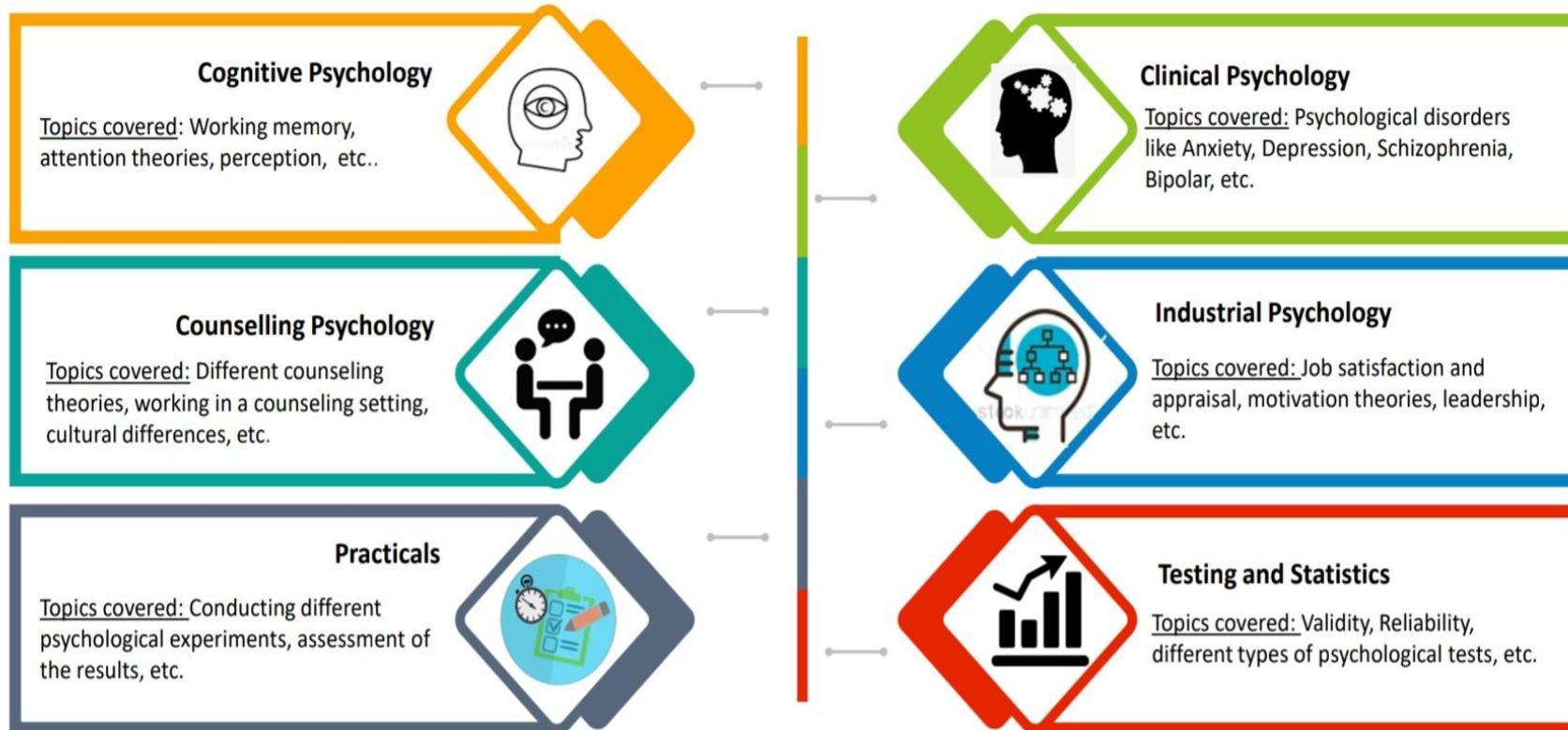
- Provides a broad and comprehensive overview of the field of human development.
- Encompasses the spectrum of human life from conception through death, chronologically.
- Studies the physical, cognitive, and social and personality development of the prenatal through late adulthood.
- Theories such as Piagetian approach to cognitive development, Marcia's approach to identity development, etc.

SOCIAL PSYCHOLOGY - Pearson

- Gives an idea why people think, feel, and act as they do. Illuminates how the social world shapes an individual.
- Its a branch of psychology that studies all aspects of a person's behaviour with & towards others, and the relationship that is developed with them.
- Focusses on heuristics, schemas, nonverbal communication, personal identity vs social identity, prejudice and discrimination, etc.
