Conducted the Academic Audit of Jai Hind College, Autonomous on 11th and 12th of December 2019 and from 9.00 am to 4.00 pm (on both days)

The team viewed the Presentation by the Principal, Controller of Examination and 21 Department (Science : 08, Commerce and allied subject : 05 and Arts : 08)

Principal gave an account of brief history of the college from its humble beginning in two classrooms of a Government College building, moving over to a Bungalow and to its current premises. The growth has been steady and struggled through heavy odds as rightly explained in the Logo.




The committee observed as under Curricular Aspects:

- College became autonomous in 2018-19 and has all Academic and other Statutory bodies in place. 

- Online book reservation
 - online book request
- Library has 10 Computer exclusively for students.
 - Foot fall in the Library is 306708 in the reference section , 18515 lending section and 1102113 hits for online catalogue (per year).
 - Library has collection of 35017 Books, 29 Journals, 124 total subscriptions, access to N list for e-journals where 8 journals accessed through e access with print and 31926 reference books.
 - Students can get three books at a time and can retain for 10 days.
 - Library committee is in place with Principal, Librarian and 5 teachers and it also includes students representation as the capacity of Secretary, Joint secretary and students volunteers.
 - Provisions are made in the budget for up gradation of infrastructure and augmentation of infrastructure.
 - College has 1 Auditorium, 1 Boardroom, one fully equipment A.V. Room
 - College has a Canteen providing variety of items at reasonable chargers.
 - College has 02 faculty common room apart from the cubicles in Lab.
 - College has a room for admin staff for their lunch and changing dress.
 - College would like to enhance but is constrained in Physical infrastructure due to Municipal norms, however making optimum use of available facilities.
 - Student representatives are visible in various committees.
 - Grievances Redressal Committee, ICC, S.C. are constituted and functional.
 - Academic progress of students is noticeable and appreciable.
 - College has eminent alumni in high position. A few prominent examples Rupa Shah (ex VC, SNDT), Ajay Primal (Industrial), Prof. R.A. Mashalker (ex Director CSIR)

- Faculty members are provided with facilities for continuous upgradation in their respective subjects.

- Around 25% of faculty members have Ph.D, M.Phil & about 10-15 have registered for Ph.D

- 02 National / International Conference in 2018 – 19.
- Students research is promoted through curriculum projects, Avishkar, Industry Projects, and Internship.
- 1000 Students have been benefited through Internship.
- Extension activities: Significant Areas :- 1) CSR Activities – Empowerment of Women, 2) Good Citizenships – Awareness amongst voters, Anti – Addition Ally, Cleanliness Drive, all sport activities with Social theme all NSS activities, Proper Nazif, etc.
- The College has adequate Infrastructure.
- College has 46872 sq.mts of land with 163744 sq.ft built up area built up areas. 

- The College has 28 Boards of Studies, Academic Council to monitor the curriculum designing / development through the regular meeting as per statutes.
- The college adheres to the statutes and ordinances of UGC, State Government and affiliating University viz University of Mumbai.
- Constitution of all Academic bodies are strictly in tune with statutory provisions with subjects experts, Industry experts and Alumni representation.

- A good number of Departments bring out their own magazine / journal with articles contributed by students.


