And Sloth effuse her opiate fumes in vain (...)


From 'The Vanity of Human Wishes' by Samuel Johnson




#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK



'Xplore' is an Annual Intra-collegiate Science Exhibition held each year to commemorate National Science Day which falls on 28th February and celebrates the occasion of Sir C.V. Raman's Birth Anniversary. It encourages young, bright and innovative students to hone their research ideas and skills. This event helps in inculcating scientific temperament among students. Some students make models, posters to explain a scientific theme/concept of their choice, while others are involved in multidisciplinary research project, literature review and exhibit their work in the form of either poster presentation or oral presentation. While this exhibition brings out the creativity in them, it also promotes the culture of pure science. By participating in this event students get an exposure to not only research but also to other soft skills like presentation, managing and teamwork. Xplore is an endeavour to make students think outside the box and go beyond their curriculum.

The main objective of 'Xplore' is to spread the joy of discovering facts while doing science, and have fun at the same time. Through this exhibition we try to inculcate into young minds love for science. Since Xplore caters to all undergraduate students, the objectives change as per their level.

First Year students – They select a topic/concept which interests them and prepare charts or models to explain the same. Main aim is to make them read beyond the syllabus and to apply the theoretical knowledge learnt throughout the Academic year.

Second Year students – They select a topic/concept which interests them and prepare charts or models to explain the same. However, as compared to the First-Year level, the Second-year students are expected to do review literature. Main objective is to improve their presentation skills, learn to review and apply literature, and increase their understanding of a particular topic of interest thus building stronger concepts.

Third Year students – At the Third-Year level, students are expected to identify a problem and attempt to find a solution for the same. The main aim is to inculcate a research aptitude, that includes reading and analysing research papers from various peer reviewed journals, and applying the techniques reviewed in literature in finding a solution to the problem identified.

By participating in Xplore, our students realise that even seemingly abstract concepts can have real life applications. Students develop curiosity and are self-motivated. As team-work is encouraged and demonstration of their work is effectively communicated, they also develop problem solving skills, improved presentation skills and soft skills.

The Xplore Exhibition is open to students of other institutions, and our participating students explain various concepts of science in a lucid language to school children. # The Rise of Entrepreneurial Spirit in Indian Women

"What? There's a woman behind this entire business? You've got to be kidding!" That's a cringe-worthy response you're likely to hear from an archetypal Indian.

Women owning and running businesses is not an entirely alien phenomenon, since we're all aware of the tiny cottage industries we learnt about in school. But that's that. For a long time, women have had to confine themselves to petty businesses.

But why have women not been as dominant as their male counterparts in business? Well, for starters, here are some of the most common problems women face in India:

The all-too-familiar red tape.

 Skeptical bankers denying credit and questioning credibility despite the proof that their loan repayment rates are higher than that of men. (United Nations Industrial Development Organization)

- Competition from the organized sector & the male-dominant entrepreneurial India
- · Family ties and homemaking responsibilities
- · Illiteracy and the lack of sound education
- A patriarchal society that doesn't willingly support or encourage women in business
- A lack of the entrepreneurial spirit and the drive to take big risks
- A so-called lack of self-confidence

This is India – the land of 'rivaaz' (tradition). As a country, we had been lagging behind on the development front in terms of 'women power' – and quite understandably so, given the orthodoxy and prevailing attitude towards the weaker sex, especially when it came to the 'role' of a woman in society. The very fact that we still read terms like 'the weaker sex' shows that this nauseating bias is ingrained in our patriarchal minds.

The winds of change have finally arrived, albeit a little late. Better late than never, right?

Welcome to modern-day India – a growing hub of opportunities waiting to be grabbed, a diverse mishmash of industries in the metropolitans, an open stage for all genders to take control of, and a marginally more open-minded community that welcomes change (for good).

It has been (and still is), however, a struggle for some women to break the shackles to aim big, take the plunge, and realize their dreams. Some get lost in oblivion, some are held back by fear and pressure, some lack conviction, some do not get the support they need, and then there are some who, despite all of the above, make it through to the top. Here's looking at some of the most interesting and aweinspiring stories of women who made a choice, stuck to it, and set an example for us to follow:

1. The 'compassionate capitalist' who did not build Biocon overnight Corporate-Secretary, Dr. Kiran Mazumdar-Shaw CMD, Biocon Ltd.

Yes, she is the chairperson & MD of Biocon Ltd. (the stellar biotechnology company), the current chairperson of IIM-Bangalore, and one of Forbes' World's 100 Most Powerful Women. But life wasn't easy for her when she forayed into the industry.

With the degree and some experience as a trainee in Aussieland, she came back to India to explore opportunities for growth. But to her dismay, she was told off here because apparently "being a Master Brewer is a man's thing."

With solid educational credentials behind her, she met Leslie Auchincloss, who was incidentally looking for an entrepreneur to help set up an Indian subsidiary of his company, Biocon Bio chemicals Ltd. Her loan application was turned down thrice by Indian banks. Biocon India was finally born in 1978 in the garage of Kiran's rented house in Bangalore with a seed capital of rs. 10,000. From heading a company that started in a tiny garage to become India's largest publicly traded Biopharmaceutical Company (with \$460 billion in revenue in 2014) that dispenses products in 85 countries, it's been one hell of a rollercoaster ride for Kiran.

2. The multitasking, multitalented serial entrepreneur, Corporate-Secretary, Sairee Chahal, Founder & CEO, Sheroes.in & Fleximoms

As the founder and CEO of Sheroes.in and Fleximoms, Sairee Chahal has crafted two businesses based on the struggles she had to deal with, being a family-oriented woman in India, thus empowering Indian women to find excellent and flexible work opportunities and enabling businesses to find the right female candidates. Sheroes was launched in 2014, and has already witnessed a footfall of 6,000 companies and over half a million women across 5,000 locations.

The need for establishing a career shop like Fleximom arose from the fact that things had gotten difficult at the workplace for Sairee when she became a mother, thanks largely to the inflexible work formats. Disinclined towards giving up what would've been a highly successful corporate career, Sairee found another way out – a better way out.

The two companies that she heads are meant for women like Sairee – women like you – who wish to strike the perfect worklife balance.

3. Breaking the social stigma with comics, Corporate-Secretary, Aditi Gupta, Founder, Menstrupedia

The two companies that she heads are meant for women like Sairee – women like you – who wish to strike the perfect worklife balance.

Amongst the most inspirational social entrepreneurs out there, Aditi Gupta is easily the gutsiest. With an aim to depict the concept of menstruation in a positive light, Aditi founded Menstrupedia in 2012, and has already managed to garner an average of 2 lac visits per month.

The idea behind the business stemmed from her own alarming experience as a child, when she got her first period at the age of 12 (and was asked to keep mum about it). A subject that is considered taboo in our society, 'menstruation' got a delightful makeover when Aditi and her husband Tuhin created the online database of comic books that aim to educate young girls about the natural human phenomenon.

Aditi's struggles and inhuman experiences as a child have translated into a social cause that will educate millions of people. Touching story, that.

4. Making the world a better place with data, Corporate-Secretary, Prukalpa Sankar, Co-founder, SocialCops

The gifted 10-year-old Prukalpa coded an HTML website for Harry Potter fans and could have gone on to become whatever she wanted. But she chose to do something for the betterment of the society. Enter SocialCops, a social enterprise that uses technology to harness the voice of the citizens to help make synergistic data-driven decisions in health, education and infrastructure.

With a dwindling bank balance of \$5000, there were problems galore, in spite of promises to fund the startup initially. But SocialCops managed to raise \$320,000 in the first round of funding and Prukalpa hasn't looked back ever since

5. Two good to be true, Corporate-Secretary, Aardra Chandra Mouli and Gayathri Thankachi V., Founders, Aeka Biochemicals Pvt. Ltd.

Establishing a biotech company in Kerela is no child's play. Ask the owners of Aeka Biochemicals Pvt. Ltd. – the first biotech and biochemical startup venture based out of Trivandrum in Kerala wholly owned by women – and they will tell you the range of challenges they came face-to-face with.

From the usual red tape to lack of information availability, and from complex legal processes to uncooperative officials, Aardra and Gayatri have a whole bunch of appalling-yet-funny anecdotes to share.

Aimed at putting the environment first and meeting the needs of the local community, Aeka was born in 2014 and is growing from strength-to-strength. From technology to finance, and from art to retail, players like Anisha Singh, Purnima Rao, Suruchi Wagh, Surabhi Dewra, Rashi Choudhary, Ankita Gaba, Ashwini Asokan and Rashi Narang are just some examples of the hordes of startup owners who are beseeching other women to stand up and do what they believe in. They fought all odds to compete with the prevailing male dominance in the business world. All it took was a little bit of courage, belief and the readiness to go all-guns-blazing.

Entrepreneurship has become a new wave among women in recent years. Women have become aware of their existence their rights and their work situation. However, women of the middle class are not too eager to alter their role in fear of social backlash. Highly educated technically sound and professionally qualified women should be encouraged for managing their own business rather than dependent on wage employment outlets. The unexplored talents of young women can be identified, trained and used for various types of industries to increase productivity in the industrial sector. A desirable environment is necessary for every woman to inculcate entrepreneurial values and involve greatly in business dealing. In this manner, more women should be encouraged for to take up entrepreneurial ventures.

## संस्कृति और सभ्यता

सामान्य आदमी और कभी-कभी विद्वान भी संस्कृति एवं सभ्यता को एक ही मानने की भूल कर बैठते हैं। जिसके कारण 'शरीर' रूपी सभ्यता का महल तो बड़ा आकर्षक बना रहता है, लेकिन संस्कृति रूपी 'आत्मा' खंडहर होने लगती है। इस आत्मा रूपी संस्कृति को बनाए रखने के लिए सभ्यता एवं संस्कृति के बीच एक महीन आवरण अदृश्य रूप से पड़ा रहता है। इस संदर्भ में अंग्रेजी की वह कहावत काफी हद तक सटीक दिखती है, जो यह बताती है कि "सभ्यता वह चीज है जो हमारे पास है, संस्कृति वह गुण है जो हममें व्याप्त है।" या दूसरे शब्दों में कहना चाहे तो- संस्कृति अभ्यंतरणीय चेतना का गहन परिष्कृत तत्त्व है तो सभ्यता बाह्य तत्त्व या उपादान है।

सभ्यता और संस्कृति के पारस्परिक संबंध को हम आत्मा एवं शरीर के उदाहरण से भलीभाँति समझ सकते हैं। यदि हम शरीर को ही (भारतीय संदर्भ में) महत्त्वपूर्ण मान लेंगे तो आत्मा तक पहुँचाना संभव नहीं होगा, और आत्मा को संपूर्ण समझकर शरीर को उपेक्षित करेंगे तो आत्मा का निवास (जीवित अवस्थाओं में) संभव नहीं होगा। क्योंकि आत्मा शरीर में ही निवास करती है। शायद इसीलिए गौतम बुद्ध ने 'मंझिम निकाय' की बात कही थी। इसीलिए सभ्यता को ही सर्वस्व मान लेने से हम संस्कृति का आत्मसाक्षात्कार नहीं कर पायेंगे।

लेकिन जिस प्रकार शरीर के बिना आत्मा का अवतरण संभव नहीं, उसी प्रकार सभ्यता को जाने बिना हम संस्कृति की पहचान नहीं कर सकेंगे। तभी तो कहा जाता है कि- "सभ्यता शरीर है और संस्कृति आत्मा।" इन दोनों के बीच बिंब और प्रतिबिंब का संबंध है। संस्कृति यदि कारण है तो सभ्यता कार्य।

सभ्यता से तात्पर्य उन भौतिक साधनों, आविष्कारों, उत्पदान के साधनों एवं सामाजिक, राजनैतिक, आर्थिक संस्थाओं से समझना चाहिए, जिनके द्वारा मनुष्य की जीवन- यात्रा सरल होती है। इसके विपरीत संस्कृति का अर्थ चिंतन तथा कलात्मक सर्जन की वे क्रियाएँ समझनी चाहिए, जो मानव व्यक्तित्व और जीवन के लिए साक्षात् उपयोगी न होते हुए भी उसे समृद्ध बनाती है। सभ्यता और संस्कृति का अंतर ही दोनों के पारस्परिक संबंध को समझने में सहायक सिद्ध होते हैं।

सभ्यता और संस्कृति के अन्तः संबंधों को स्पष्ट करते हुए 'वाचस्पित गैरोला' के विचार हैं- संस्कृति का आधार मुख्यतः आचारों और सभ्यता का आधार मुख्यतः विचारों से है। आचारों से संस्कृति का और विचारों से सभ्यता का निर्माण हुआ है। इस दृष्टि से आचारों और विचारों का जो पारस्पिरक संबंध है, संस्कृति और सभ्यता का वही सामान्यतः संबंध है। किसी दुराचारी व्यक्ति में सिद्धचारों का योग होना संभव नहीं है। इसी प्रकार किसी विचार शून्य व्यक्ति में सदाचारों का होना प्रायः कठिन है। इससे यह सिद्ध होता है कि आचारों और विचारों का परस्पर अभिन्न संबंध है। अतः संस्कृति और सभ्यता दोनों परस्परापेक्ष्य सिद्ध होती हैं। सभ्यता और संस्कृति के अन्तः संबंधों को कुछ इसी प्रकार से स्पष्ट करते हुए 'बाबूराम मैहला' का कथन भी देखा जा सकता है।

"सभ्यता निश्चित रूप से भौतिक है। यह बाह्य आभूषण मात्र है। संस्कृति आत्मा का श्रृंगार करती है, वह हृदय भाव की उदात्तता है तथा मन को विमल विचारों से सुशोभित करती है। सभ्यता बर्हिमुखी है तो संस्कृति अन्तर्मुखी। सभ्यता नवीन आविष्कारों, उत्पादन के साधनों तथा सामाजिक संस्थाओं से अपने स्वरूप को उन्नत करती हुई जीवन-यात्रा को सुगम और सरल बनाती है, पर संस्कृति इनसे बेखबर रहकर भी अपना जीवन दर्शन विकसित कर सकती है।

इस प्रकार हम कह सकते हैं कि संस्कृति सभ्यता की अपेक्षा अधिक सूक्ष्म होती है। यह सभ्यता में उसी तरह व्याप्त रहती है, जैसे फूल में सुगंध। संस्कृति जीवन जीने की एक शैली है, और यह शैली सदियों से जमा होकर उस समाज में छायी रहती है, जिसमें हम जन्म लेते हैं। संस्कार या संस्कृति वास्तव में शरीर का नहीं आत्मा का गुण है, और सभ्यता से हमारा नाता शरीर के साथ ही टूट जाता है। किन्तु संस्कृति का प्रभाव हमारी आत्मा के साथ जन्म-जन्मांतर तक चलता रहता है। आदान-प्रदान की प्रक्रिया ही संस्कृति की जान है और इसी के सहारे वह अपने आपको जिंदा रखती है।

आचार्य रामचंद्र शुक्ल ने कहा है कि "साहित्य समाज का दर्पण होता है। जिस युग की जैसी संस्कृति होती है, वैसा ही साहित्य समाज में आता है और उस साहित्य का समाज की संस्कृति एवं संस्कार पर भी असर पड़ता है। उन सांस्कृतिक मूल्यों का वास्तविक आधार मानव व्यक्तित्व की वे अवस्थाएँ या रूप हैं, जो वांछनीय और अनुकरणीय जान पड़ते हैं। किसी देश के साहित्य में हम मानव जीवन अथवा मानव व्यक्तित्व के उन रूपों का वर्णन पाते हैं, जिन्हें वहाँ के साहित्यकारों ने भावात्मक अथवा निषेधात्मक रूप में अर्थवान अथवा उल्लेखनीय समझा है। यह सच है कि किसी देश की संस्कृति के प्रधान प्रतिनिधि वहाँ के साहित्यकार होते हैं।

देश या समाज में मानव व्यक्तित्व तथा जीवन में संबंधित छोटे-बड़े असंख्य भाव प्रचलित या प्रतिष्ठित होते हैं, उनका पूर्ण आकलन वहाँ के साहित्य में ही हो पाता है। इस प्रकार संस्कृति और साहित्य में अटूट संबंध है। संस्कृति की शाश्वतता ही उसे अजर-अमर करती है और वही साहित्य की अचल संपत्ति है। ऐसे साहित्य में संस्कृति के मूल्य खोजने की आवश्यकता नहीं पड़ती, बल्कि संस्कृति साहित्य का प्राण बनकर उसमें घुली-मिली रहती है।

संस्कृति एवं साहित्य की अन्योन्याश्रितता के संदर्भ में विद्यानिवास मिश्र जी का मंतव्य द्रष्टव्य है- "प्रत्येक संस्कृति की सर्वश्रेष्ठ अभिव्यंजना साहित्य में होती है। दूसरे शब्दों में, संस्कृति को पहचानने की कई आँखें हैं, कलाएँ हैं, दर्शन हैं, आचार-पद्धितयाँ हैं, हमारी अपनी शब्दावली में धर्म है, इतिहास-पुराण हैं, इतिहास-पुरृष हैं। परंतु साहित्य वाली आँख कुछ ज्यादा देखती हैं, और उस देखने में एक विशेषता होती है, वह अपने को देखती है। संस्कृति का जो चित्र साहित्य में मिलता है, वह संस्कृति के मूल प्रयोजन, मूल्यों के सर्जन की प्रक्रिया को आगे बढ़ाने के उद्देश्य से चित्रित मिलता है। वह चित्र ऐसा होता है जो पढ़ने वाले को तो उस चित्र की प्रक्रिया का साझीदार बनाता ही है, उसके भीतर के चित्रकार को, रचनाकार को भी उभार देता है, उसकी सर्जक आँख खोल देता है।

भारतीय साहित्य में वेद और लोक (पूर्वी उत्तर प्रदेश की सरल जनता इसे वेद के तुकांत के रूप में 'लवेद' कहती है।) ये दो शब्द विभिन्न प्रकार के सांस्कृतिक समुदाय को संकेतित करते हैं। जो अपने बौद्धिक विकास के कारण संस्कृति की दो पृथक-पृथक धाराओं के रूप में दिखाई देते हैं- (1) शिष्ट संस्कृति (2) लोक संस्कृति। शिष्ट संस्कृति से तात्पर्य उस अभिजात वर्ग की संस्कृति से है जो बौद्धिक विकास के उच्चतम शिखर पर पहुँचा हुआ था। यह वर्ग अपनी प्रतिभा के कारण समाज का अग्रणी और पथ-प्रदर्शक था। इसकी संस्कृति का स्रोत वेद और शास्त्र थे। किंतु लोक-संस्कृति जन साधारण की वह संस्कृति है जो अपनी प्रेरणा लोक से प्राप्त करती थी, जिसकी उत्स भूमि जनता थी जो बौद्धिक विकास की दृष्टि से निम्न धरातल पर थी।

शिष्ट संस्कृति एवं लोक संस्कृति पर अपना मत स्पष्ट करते हुए पं. बलदेव उपाध्याय ने लिखा है कि "लोक संस्कृति शिष्ट संस्कृति की सहायक होती है। किसी देश के धार्मिक विश्वासों, अनुष्ठानों तथा क्रिया कलापों के पूर्ण परिचय के लिए दोनों संस्कृतियों में सहयोग अपेक्षित रहता है। इस दृष्टि से अथर्ववेद, ऋग्वेद का पूरक है। ये दोनों संहिताएँ दो विभिन्न संस्कृतियों के स्वरूप की परिचायकाएँ हैं। अथर्ववेद लोक संस्कृति का परिचायक है तो ऋग्वेद शिष्ट संस्कृति का। अथर्ववेद के विचारों का धरातल सामान्य जनजीवन है तो ऋग्वेद का विशिष्ट जनजीवन है।

जहाँ ऋग्वेद में यज्ञ-यज्ञादिक का विधान पाया जाता है। वहीं अथर्ववेद में अंधिविश्वास, टोना टोटका, जादू, मंत्र आदि का। इस प्रकार ऋग्वेद शिष्ट संस्कृति के जन के विचारों की झाँकी प्रस्तुत करता है तो अथर्ववेद में लोक-संस्कृति का चित्रण उपलब्ध होता है। अतः ये दोनों वेद दो भिन्न संस्कृतियों के प्रतीक हैं। उपनिषद् काल में भी दोनों संस्कृतियाँ स्पष्ट रूप से दिखाई पड़ती हैं। जिन उपनिषदों में आत्मा, परमात्मा, जीव, जगत, ब्रह्म, माया, प्रकृति आदि का वर्णन है, वे अभिजात संस्कृति के ग्रंथ है। परंतु जिनमें लोक जीवन का वर्णन है, लोक-विश्वास और लोक-परंपराओं का उल्लेख है उनका संबंध निश्चय ही लोक-संस्कृति और लोक-परंपराओं का उल्लेख है उनका संबंध निश्चय ही लोक-संस्कृति से है। गृह्यसूत्रों को यदि लोक संस्कृति का विश्वकोष कहें तो कुछ अत्युक्ति न होगी।

पाली जातकों में लोक-संस्कृति का सजीव चित्रण किया गया है। आदि किव वाल्मिकी से लेकर किवकुल गुरु कालिदास तक की रचनाओं में शिष्ट-जन एवं साधारण जन में प्रचलित दो भाषाओं का उल्लेख मिलता है, जिससे ध्वनित होता है तत्कालीन समाज में दो पृथक सांस्कृतिक धाराएँ थी। स्वयं भगवान कृष्ण ने श्रीमद्भागवद् गीता में स्वीकार किया है कि- यस्मात्क्षरमतीतोऽहमक्षरादिप चोत्तमः

अतोऽस्मि लोके वेदे च प्रथितः पुरुषोत्तमः।। अतोऽस्मि लोके वेदे च प्रथितः पुरुषोत्तमः।।

अतोऽस्मि लोके वेदे च प्रथितः पुरुषोत्तमः।। अर्थात् "मैं क्षर-अक्षर दोनों से परे हूँ, चूँिक मैं सर्वश्रेष्ठ हूँ अतएव मैं इस लोक तथा वेद में परमपुरुष के नाम से विख्यात हूँ।" संस्कृत के नाटकों में श्रेष्ठ पात्रों के लिए संस्कृत भाषा का व्यवहार किया गया है तथा चेरी (दासी) एवं अन्य निम्न कोटि के पात्र विभिन्न प्रकार की प्राकृत बोलते पाए गये हैं। इस प्रकार हम देख सकते हैं कि वैदिक काल से ही इस देश में शिष्ट संस्कृति और लोक संस्कृति की दो पृथक धाराएँ बहती रही हैं जो मध्यकाल तक प्रवाहित होती रही।



The Departments of BAF (Bachelor of Accounting and Finance), BBI (Bachelor of Banking and Insurance), and BFM (Bachelor of Financial Markets) at Jai Hind College have continually strived to provide students with a strong academic foundation in finance and business-related subjects while encouraging personal and professional growth outside the academic curriculum. These Departments have made significant progress over the years, ensuring students are equipped with the skills and knowledge required to excel in the competitive and evolving financial world. Their focus extends beyond academic achievements, encouraging students to participate in activities that foster both personal and professional growth.

The Departments offer students a rigorous academic experience, evident in the excellent results achieved year after year. However, the faculty's commitment to student success is not limited to academics. In the academic year 2023-24, the departments introduced various courses that go beyond the traditional curriculum to prepare students for real-world challenges. Among these is the 'Advanced MS Office with ChatGPT and AI' course, conducted by Mr. Pankaj Singhal. This course equipped students with essential IT skills, including advanced Excel functions, financial functions and an introduction to the use of AI tools like ChatGPT. #### Bachelor of Business Administration - BBA in Collaboration with TCS

The Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) program at Jai Hind College is designed in collaboration with Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) and focuses on industry integration, providing students with practical exposure to business processes and management practices. The Department offers an innovative and forward-thinking curriculum that is regularly updated to meet industry standards and trends. The Department has strengthened its collaboration with TCS, offering sessions for BBA students and increasing industry exposure through internships and project-based learning.

The National Education Policy (NEP) aims to make Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) programs more holistic, multidisciplinary, and industry-aligned, emphasizing practical and experiential learning. The focus within the BBA curriculum is on nurturing entrepreneurial and managerial skills, fostering critical thinking, and enhancing problem-solving capabilities. Through a blend of foundational business

knowledge, specialization options, internships, and projects, students will develop the competencies needed to thrive in dynamic and complex business environments. The NEP also encourages integrating technology, ethical leadership, and global perspectives to prepare graduates for leadership roles in a rapidly changing economic landscape.

Efforts are being made to achieve 100% internship and placement. Currently, 94 out of 120 students secured internships, with some converting to pre-placement offers and third year students had 100 percent internship record. Internships are a significant part of the BBA program, with a strong network of companies like Morgan Stanley, HDFC Life, and Taj Hotels offering placements. A notable achievement is the conversion of three student internships into pre-placement offers at Morgan Stanley. The BBA graduating batch of 2024 at Jai Hind College has set a remarkable precedent with its excellent placement record. This achievement is a testament to the students' hard work, resilience, and industry-readiness cultivated during their academic journey. Leading organizations across diverse sectors, including finance, marketing, consulting, and technology, have recruited our graduates, offering lucrative packages and promising career paths. The success stems from robust industry collaborations, practical training modules, and dedicated career guidance provided. Our graduates' ability to adapt, innovate, and excel in dynamic work environments has made them highly sought-after by employers, reflecting the institution's commitment to holistic and quality education.

The curriculum is structured to offer both theoretical knowledge and practical insights into various aspects of business management, including entrepreneurship, finance, marketing, human resources, and business ethics. The courses are designed to meet the evolving needs of industries.

The specialization areas include Business Process Management which focus on managing and improving business processes to achieve operational efficiency, Entrepreneurship and Innovation which offering hands-on exposure to starting and managing new ventures and Digital Marketing and E-commerce that equip students with digital skills required in today's business environment. The department offers value-added certificate courses in partnership with organizations like Wadhwani Foundation and IIDE, enhancing students' practical skills in areas such as advertising, trading, and marketing. Students are actively encouraged to participate in research activities, with various courses promoting research-oriented projects. Workshops on Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) and research publications are integral to the Department's research culture.

The Department has a robust mentoring system in place, with structured sessions that focus on goal setting, career planning, conflict resolution, and communication skills. The student-teacher ratio of 5:1 (FY BBA) and 3:1 (SY BBA) ensures personalized attention for academic and career guidance. Regular feedback is collected from students to ensure quality improvement and responsiveness to student needs.

Students participated in various national and international business events, such as the 'Study Australia Entrepreneurship Challenge'. Students have been involved in live projects with companies like Bombay Shirt Company. Jai Hind College BMS and BBA represented India at The HSBC/ HKU Case competition (the largest undergraduate case competition in the world) in Hong Kong this year and secured 1st place in round one in Hong Kong. The APAC level was preceded by a rigorous couple of rounds in India where 780 teams participated. The TYBBA Student Kaamiya Makhija along with three other BMS student represented India in HSBC/HKU Asia Pacific Business Case Competition 2024 organised by HKU business School and ACRC supported by HSBC. The faculty and students actively engage in academic research,

contributing to national and international conferences. Faculty members have presented research on topics such as 'Start-ups in India' and 'Impact of Films on Youth' at various events.

The Vocational Journal 2023-2024 of the BBA programme of Jai Hind College is a testament to the collaborative spirit and dedication of its students, who played an integral role in its creation. The Journal showcases a diverse range of contributions that highlight their creativity, entrepreneurial ventures, academic achievements, and experiences in various fields such as environmental projects, sustainable fashion initiatives, and digital marketing. Students have contributed personal stories of founding businesses, such as jewellery and apparel brands, reflecting their entrepreneurial zeal. The editorial team of the Journal, composed of enthusiastic students, worked to ensure the publication serves as a rich resource for knowledge and motivation. It features insights from guest speakers, management projects, and workshops aimed at developing business acumen and soft skills. The Journal is more than a publication—it is a collaborative platform that inspires peers to excel and bridges academic learning with real-world applications.

The Jai Hind Business Conclave 2023-24, hosted by Jai Hind College's BBA department, brought together budding business leaders, industry experts, and students from across the country in a grand two-day event on December 15th and 16th, 2023. Held at the college campus in Mumbai, the Conclave aimed to bridge the gap between education and the corporate world, providing students with immersive, real-world experiences. This year's Conclave was a resounding success, with over 3000 attendees engaging in dynamic events, speaker sessions, and workshops. The department focuses on social responsibility through projects like the Clean Marine Project, Project Tech Shiksha, and Mental Health Awareness Drives. The Entrepreneurship Cell and Skill Hub provide a platform for students to develop entrepreneurial skills and launch start-ups. The department is equipped with state-of-the-art facilities including smart classrooms, Wi-Fi, projectors, and a smartboard to facilitate modern teaching methodologies.

Looking ahead, the Department plans to further enhance industry collaborations, expand international linkages, and explore the possibility of introducing post-graduate programs. #### Biotechnology

The Department of Biotechnology has had an exciting and productive academic year, 2023-24, characterized by several enriching academic and co-curricular activities aimed at promoting holistic student development and aligning with the latest educational reforms. The Department continuously strives to promote research, innovation, and entrepreneurial culture along with sustainable practices.

To welcome the incoming batch of students, the Department hosted a vibrant **Orientation Program on July 15, 2023**. The program introduced first year students to the academic structure, departmental facilities, faculty members, and the support systems available. Special emphasis was placed on familiarizing students with research opportunities, industry collaborations, and career prospects in biotechnology.

In compliance with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the Department organized a Board of Studies (BoS) meeting on **July 30, 2023** to finalise the new curriculum for the first-year students. During this meeting, esteemed academicians, industry experts, and faculty members and alumni came together to frame a syllabus that not only adheres to NEP 2020 guidelines but also reflects the latest advancements in biotechnology.

On **August 8, 2023, Ms. Dievya Gohil**, an alumnus of the department and Ph D Scholar at the Advanced Centre for Treatment, Research and Education in Cancer delivered an engaging and insightful talk on Transplantation Biology with special focus on Graft Versus Host Disease. Over 100 students from the various biosciences departments attended the session and learnt about the scope and challenges related to transplantation. In another seminar attended by over 80 students of Biotechnology, **Ms. Srika Amin**, an alumnus of the Department and a certified Genetic Counsellor at Miami Cancer hospital, Florida State, USA, delivered an interesting talk on "Genetic counselling with special emphasis on cancer counselling."

The highlight of the academic year was the two-day intercollegiate festival, **Genaces 2023** held on **8th and 9th September 2023**, which saw participation from various colleges in the city. The event was organised under the aegis of IIC and was planned mainly by the second-year students with support from the final year students and first-year students. The first day featured expert speakers **Dr. Girish Walawalkar** and **Ms Jagruti Bhatia** from different fields of Biotechnology. These sessions provided insights on how to become an entrepreneur and the future scope of Biotechnology. On the second day, the festival transformed into a lively, interactive event with science-based games, marketing events, quizzes, and hands-on activities designed to make learning fun. The student-led event demonstrated team spirit, creativity, and a passion for scientific inquiry. The combination of knowledge sharing and playful competition made Genaces 2023 a resounding success and a much-anticipated event in the academic calendar.

In response to the growing demand for professionals in the field of genetic counselling, the Department introduced a 30-hour value-added certificate course in Genetic Counselling. Ms. Srika Amin, a certified Genetic Counsellor at Miami Cancer hospital, Florida State, USA, conducted most of the sessions. Dr. Kruti Pandya coordinated the course and served as resource person along with other faculty members, viz., Ms. Nandini Desai and Ms. Ruqayya Manasawala. This course, conducted in a hybrid mode during the time of November 2023 to January 2024 totaling to over 30 hours, equipped students with insights into genetic disorders, diagnostic techniques, and the ethical considerations surrounding genetic testing. The sessions were highly engaging and informative experience for all participants. The course received excellent feedback and added significant value to the academic offerings of the Department.

A bridge course in Mathematics was conducted by Ms. Vedika Bane and Ms. Ruqayya Manasawala during the first term for helping the first-year students who did not have Mathematics in their board curriculum. A debate on the topics of Sustainable Technology is a reality today and AI is a boon for Biotechnology advancement, were conducted by the Biotechnology Society under the aegis of IQAC on July 31, 2023. It served to provide a platform for the students to explore and express their

thoughts and opinions on sustainable technology and the pros and cons of AI.

The Department organized a Parent-Teacher Interaction Meeting on September 19, 2023, aimed at building a strong connection between faculty and the families of students. This meeting offered an open platform for parents to understand their ward's academic performance, address concerns, and engage in discussions with faculty members regarding career guidance and the future scope of biotechnology. The collaborative discussions were well-received and strengthened the Department's commitment to maintaining transparent communication with stakeholders.

The final-year students exhibited their projects via "Nutripreneur" on nutrition and dietetics as part of their Applied Component assessment at the end of their fifth semester. On December 20, 2023, the final year and second-year Biotechnology students had the opportunity to visit the Institute of Chemical Technology, Mumbai and understand the various topics of research and development at the institute.

In November 2023, a team of three second year students – Ms. Kanak Joshi, Ms. Koushani Hom Roy, and Mr. Rushabh Mujumdar, mentored by Dr. Kruti Pandya, participated in the Australian National University Health and Medicine case study competition, and won the first position among participants from all over the country. A team of three final year students – Ms. Divayanka Tanna, Ms. Anishka Anilkumar and Ms. Aaisha Ansari, mentored by Ms. Ruqayya Manasawala, participated in the 18th Intercollegiate Research Convention Aavishkar held by the University of Mumbai at Lala Lajpat Rai college on December 09, 2023, and was selected further for the podium round. Faculty member, Ms. Ruqayya Manasawala, too presented a project at Aavishkar at Lala Lajpatrai College on December 09, 2023, and the poster was selected for the podium round followed by selection for the Final Round of Aavishkar held at Vaze Kelkar College on December 18, 2023.

Two teams of final year students (team 1: Ms. Arunima Chattopadhyay; team 2: Ms. Divyanka Tanna, Anisha Anilkumar and Aaisha Ansari) mentored by Dr. Monalisa Chakraborty and Ms. Ruqayya Manasawala won the first and second positions respectively at research meet – E Shodh 2024 held on January 6, 2024. Students of the department also won several prizes at an exhibition event – Xplore 2024 held on February 28, 2024, with the first-year and second year students winning the first and second positions, the final year students winning the second position.

The Department organised a one-day workshop on February 16, 2024, on column chromatography under the guidance of Dr. Hiral Pandya and Dr. Kruti Pandya. The workshop provided hands-on experience to approximately 60 students of the various science departments of the college. The students learnt many practical aspects of the technique and enjoyed performing the practical. The final year students worked on various research projects as part of their sixth semester requirement and presented their findings in the month of March 2024.

The faculty of the Department worked towards improving their competencies by participating in Faculty Development Programmes, seminars, and workshops. The staff were also external examiners for graduate and post graduate examinations at various colleges in the city. Dr. Kruti Pandya published a chapter in IIP series titled Genotyping- New Era in Disease Typing in April 2024. Dr. Kruti Pandya was appointed as Faculty Coordinator for IIC and Dr. Nissey Sunil was appointed as the Green Club Faculty Coordinator at the College.

The Biotechnology Department continues to strive for excellence in academic innovation, student engagement, and community building. We look forward to furthering our contributions to the academic and scientific community in the coming years.

#### **Botany**

One of the oldest Departments in Jai Hind College since 1962, Botany is offered as a Major subject (6 units) along with Horticulture and Gardening as an Applied Component. It is also being offered as a Major and Minor subject at the NEP level from 2023 - 2024. The Department was recognized by the University of Mumbai for M. Phil., M. Sc. (By Research) from 1980, and Ph.D. (Science) in the subject of Botany from the year 1984.

The Department is currently recognized for Ph.D. with 3 active research guides and has produced 22 Ph.D. and 10 M.Sc. (By Research) Post Graduates to date. Currently, 3 Ph.D. students are registered under Dr. S. A. Godbole's guidance (Present HOD), 2 Ph.D. students are registered under the guidance of Dr. Devangi Chachad, and 1 PhD student is registered under the guidance of Dr. Payal Acharekar.

Our USP is that all faculty members are highly motivated towards research and improving their academic qualifications. The Department is funded under the Star DBT scheme. To inculcate a research temperament and culture in students, we encourage them to work on research projects and participate in intercollegiate research competitions and conferences. Being an autonomous college, we bring in quick modifications in syllabi, to suit industry requirements and job opportunities. Field excursions are made to interesting jungles to observe nature much more closely.

The Department of Botany has always been organising various student-friendly events like guest lectures along with the active participation of faculty members in various fields. The year 2023- 2024 was no different. The Department organised various workshops and guest lectures. Eminent speakers were invited to share their expertise and knowledge. WE collaborated with the Green Club and organised a workshop namely Plantastic which was to create awareness of the use of waste plastic pet bottles into planters.

Dr. Bharati Bist is an active member for National Institute Ranking Framework Team (NIRF), AA committee, Nature club and Documentation Incharge for the Botany Department. Dr. Devangi Chachad, Dr. Payal Acharekar, Dr. Archana Ashtekar and Dr. Bharati Bist are active members of NAAC SSR committee and have worked on the submission of SSR.

Dr. Devangi Chachad was granted a patent. Dr. Devangi Chachad along with her Ph.D. students, published a total of four research papers. Two papers in peer-reviewed journals, one paper in the Web of Science listed journal, and one paper in Scopus listed journal. She, along with her Ph.D. students, Ms. Saloni Kothari and Ms. Ruqayya Manasawala, presented a total of three papers at the National Conference organised by Indian Botanical Society. Ms. Ruqayya Manasawala working under the guidance of Dr. Devangi Chachad for her Ph.D., participated in Avishkar and was selected for the next round. Dr. Payal Acharekar guided her student Ms. Munazzah to present her work at Avishkar. Dr. Bharat Bist along with her undergraduate student has successfully published a research article in a peer-reviewed journal. Dr. Bharati Bist has contributed a Chapter in a Reference book by the Indian Women Scientists' Association (IWSA). Dr Archana Ashtekar published a paper in the Journal of Phyto Nanotechnology and Pharmaceutical Sciences and edited a book titled "Advances in Agriculture Sciences Volume III. She is on the editorial board of the Journal of Phyto Nanotechnology and Pharmaceutical Sciences.

A total of more than 120 researchers, experts, educators, students, and enthusiasts attended the lecture.

Dr. Payal Acharekar attended various skill development programs in both online and offline mode such as 'Exploring Government Funds and Grants for Research and Development', 'Designing Vocational Skills Courses under NEP 2020 and Industry Academia collaboration', 'The Evolving Role of Teachers in 21st Century Classroom under NEP 2020 - Pedagogies and Assessments' and Applied and Basic Aspects

in Plant Sciences for Sustainable Future. She also has a Collaboration with the Environment Agency of South Africa. She also visited Khalsa college to deliver a guest lecture to all the Green club members. The Department of Chemistry at Jai Hind College is a thriving academic hub known for its commitment to excellence in teaching and research. With a dynamic blend of theoretical and practical approaches, the Department nurtures a vibrant community of students and scholars. Our faculty is dedicated to providing a holistic education that emphasizes handson learning, which is evident in initiatives under Chemical Society. The Department's forward-thinking ethos prepares students for both academic research and industrial careers.

The Department's guiding motto, "Igniting Minds, Fostering Innovation," reflects its ongoing mission to cultivate intellectual curiosity and drive innovation. This year, our objectives revolved around bridging the gap between theory and practice. Through experiential learning opportunities, industry engagement, and student-led research projects, we sought to expose students to the real-world applications of their academic studies. The central focus was on advanced analytical techniques and fostering student independence in research, particularly through collaborative projects and interactive workshops.

The faculty of the Department have achieved significant milestones this year, further solidifying our reputation in the academic community. Dr. Supriya Deshmukh and Dr. Sajith Chandran were awarded Ph.D. guideship by the University of Mumbai, allowing them to further contribute to research mentorship. In addition, Dr. Shilpa Jain received her M.Sc. recognition from the Postgraduate Section of the University. Moreover, Dr. B.K.N. Singh continued to play a pivotal role in curriculum development by serving on the Board of Studies (BoS) at institutions like Somaiya College, K.C. College, and R.J. College. Dr. Sreela Dasgupta's role as a resource person at a State-Level Faculty Development Program on 'Understanding National Education Policy 2020' demonstrated our faculty's leadership in implementing educational reforms. Her insights on Outcome-Based Education helped other educators align their teaching strategies with the evolving national policies. In another significant achievement, Dr. Shilpa Jain was awarded second prize in the oral presentation category at the One-Day National Conference on Advances in Polymer Science and Technology, held at the University Department of Chemistry, University of Mumbai, on 16th March 2024.

Professional development has been a key focus for our faculty as well. Both Dr. B.K.N. Singh and Dr. Aksh Hina Shaikh attended a two-day workshop on Computational Chemistry at ICT Matunga, expanding their knowledge of computational tools and their applications in chemistry education. Additionally, faculty members Dr. Shilpa Jain and Dr. Onkar Lotlikar mentored students through various SWAYAM NPTEL courses, guiding them to achieve certifications that added immense value to their academic profiles. Dr. Onkar Lotlikar and Ms. Khatija Atthar further enhanced their teaching skills by attending a one-week Capacity Building Program for UG Science teachers, organized by the Maharashtra State Faculty Development Academy (MSFDA), held at TIFR-HBCSE, Mumbai, from 11th to 16th March 2024. The Department also continued its collaborative efforts with Sophia College, where faculty members of the Department led a 4-credit Research Methodology course for M.Sc. Part 1 students.

The **CheMentor Initiative** was the flagship program of the year, designed to enhance student understanding of sophisticated analytical instruments like High-Performance Liquid Chromatography (HPLC) and Spectrofluorimetry. Through a series of hands-on workshops, this initiative provided invaluable training to over 149 students from esteemed colleges, such as St. Xavier's, Patkar College, and Bhavan's College. The sessions, conducted by our expert faculty including Mr. Gokul Ganesan, Dr. Shilpa Jain, and Dr. Aksh Hina Shaikh, covered practical applications of these instruments in fields ranging from pharmaceuticals to quantum dot detection. Students were guided through every stage of analysis, from sample preparation and instrument calibration to data interpretation, making them proficient in the use of these advanced tools. The CheMentor program not only enhanced students' technical skills but also cultivated their research capabilities, preparing them for future academic and industry challenges. Feedback from participants reflected a deep appreciation for the real-time experience with high-end instruments, which many students found transformative in their understanding of Analytical Chemistry.

In addition to CheMentor, the Department placed a strong emphasis on student research and professional development. M.Sc. Part 1 students secured prestigious internships at institutions like Bhabha Atomic Research Centre (BARC), Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Indore, and the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). Meanwhile, our T.Y. B.Sc. students continued to excel, with two students securing placements at Hindustan Unilever Limited (HUL) as R&D trainees. This highlights the Department's ongoing commitment to not only providing quality education but also ensuring employability and career readiness.

Our Department takes immense pride in the accomplishments of our students who have secured prestigious positions in various PhD programs. Ms. Hritivi Doshi, a TY BSc student, successfully gained admission to the integrated PhD program at Tata Institute of Fundamental Research (TIFR), Mumbai, after clearing its highly competitive entrance examination and interview. From the M.Sc. program, Hummad Sayed and Shreyas Dindorkar secured PhD admissions at IIT Palakkad and IIT Gandhinagar, respectively. Additionally, Atharva Sapre and Aniket Chaudhari, both from the M.Sc. program, earned places in PhD programs at the Czech Academy of Sciences, Prague, and the Polish Academy of Sciences.

Our M.Sc. Part 2 students showcased their talents by winning the 'Best College' prize at Chemscope, an intercollegiate festival hosted by Sophia College. Moreover, SYBSc students actively participated in the University of Mumbai's Avishkar Research Meet. Under the

mentorship of our dedicated faculty, three teams presented their research findings, exemplifying the Department's commitment to research and innovation.

Additionally, our students had enriching experiences outside the college through industrial and institutional visits. On 19th October 2023, M.Sc. Part 1 and 2 students visited Anton Paar Ltd., where they were given a demonstration on the Particle Size Analyzer, helping them understand its applications in particle analysis. Furthermore, the students visited the Center for Excellence in Basic Sciences (UoM-CEBS), a Department of Atomic Energy (DAE) initiative, on National Science Day (28th February 2024). This visit offered them a glimpse into cuttingedge scientific research and national advancements in basic sciences.

Research has been another cornerstone of our department's activities. Several S.Y. B.Sc. students engaged in short-term research projects under faculty mentorship, presenting their findings to the broader student body. These presentations were particularly impactful for F.Y. B.Sc. students, encouraging them to consider early involvement in research. The department also held interactive sessions, such as the ice-breaking event for F.Y. B.Sc. students, where 70 participants engaged in team-building activities. These sessions fostered a sense of community within the department, creating a supportive learning environment that will continue to benefit students throughout their academic journey.

The Chemistry Department at Jai Hind College continues to stand out as a beacon of academic excellence and innovation. With initiatives like CheMentor, collaborations with leading institutions, and a focus on research-driven education, we are committed to shaping the next generation of scientists and professionals. Our emphasis on experiential learning, professional development, and industry engagement ensures that our students are not only academically equipped but also well-prepared for the dynamic world of chemical sciences.

The Department of Economics is dedicated to fostering academic growth, intellectual curiosity, and practical understanding of economic principles. The Department consists over 150 students, and in 2023, strived to organize a diverse range of events that encourage both professional development and social responsibility

The 10th edition of Arthanomics, Jai Hind College's flagship Economics and Business festival, was held on August 11 and 12, 2023. Led by Ms. Sarita Jaishankar as faculty-in-charge, Sarthak Giri Goswami as chairperson, and Angel Mahajan as vice chairperson, the festival attracted over 350 participants from 14+ colleges across Mumbai, including NMIMS and KC College, with an impressive footfall of over 5000 students. The event kicked off with a ribbon-cutting ceremony by the Principal. The public relations team, led by Shivangi Nanwani, and the sponsorship team, led by Kirti Sewani, secured sponsors like Fazlani Foods and Belgian Waffles.

Ten diverse events organized by **Prisha Shah**, such as **'War at Wall Street'** (a stock market simulation), **'Fantasy Football'** (a sports auction event), and **'The Case Conquest'** (a case-study competition), were some of the major highlights. Judges from various industries provided expert feedback, ensuring the participants gained valuable insights. The MAC team, led by Nandini Johri and Sanaea Katpitia, transformed the venue with breathtaking decorations, while the smooth coordination by Puneet Kaur's logistics team ensured flawless execution throughout the festival. On December 3, 2023, Arthanomics collaborated with the Robin Hood Army for a CSR event where students helped children create six calendars. The event took place in a local garden, with members assisting the children in crafting calendars while fostering a sense of teamwork and creativity. This initiative provided a fun and productive experience for both the children and the volunteers.

Organized by **The Contrarian**, the Department's official publication, the **Fundamentals of Taxation Masterclass** was held on **December 6 and 7, 2023**. At its helm were **Mahek Kanungo** and **Mahek Sadhwani** as **Editor-in-chief** and **Managing Editor** respectively, with Ms. Sarita Jaishankar as the faculty-in-charge. Tax expert Amit Gupta, with over two decades of experience, guided 55 Arts FY, SY, and TY students through the complexities of tax filing and saving. The session featured hands-on demonstrations and Q&A segments, equipping students with the tools to confidently navigate tax regulations as they enter the workforce. The masterclass was praised for simplifying tax concepts and empowering students to manage their finances effectively.

On **January 9, 2024**, students from the Economics Association participated in the ORF Spark Dialogue at TISS, Mumbai with Ms. Vaidehi Dhamankar and Ms. Vibhuti Gunjal. The event, titled **"Horizons of Hope: The Youth and Global Futures,"** featured experts discussing how young people can contribute to shaping global futures. TY students from the Department benefited from these forward-thinking discussions, gaining a better understanding of youth challenges and opportunities in a global context.

**CONceptual 2024**, the flagship event of The Contrarian, was held on February 21 and 22, 2024, under the theme 'A Rich Man's World,' focusing on late-stage capitalism. The event featured five teams presenting research papers on topics such as the Shadow Economy and Silver Economy, highlighting challenges and opportunities in India. The Department of English, Jai Hind College, is one of the oldest departments dating back to the foundation of the College in 1948. The Department of English has always boasted of dynamic academicians and scholars, as well as talented and versatile alumni, all of whom have contributed to making it one of the most sought after departments in the city. The English Association, the cultural wing of the Department, regularly holds seminars, workshops and hosts talks by various eminent guest speakers from reputed universities across the world.

In accordance with the principles of Horizontal Governance, there is diffusion of responsibilities in the Department. Ms June Dias was the teacher-in-charge of the Book and Bake Sale, the Festival 'Kalki' and the Workshop on Journalistic Ethics and Fact-checking. She was also in charge of the Film Room with Dr Deepna Rao. Dr Deepna Rao was the teacher in charge of the Novel Room and the Film Room, the two discussion clubs under the aegis of the Department. Dr Anamika Purohit, Staff Editor of the Department Magazine Hwaethwugu and finally Ms. Radhika Rajwani is the teacher in charge of the Annual English Seminar.

The year began on the theme of 'The Absurd at Play', for the Annual Fundraiser, the Book and Bake Sale on August 1, 2023. Featuring over 200 books on sale, as well as a photo booth, and various food and merchandise stalls, this event was one of the most memorable on the calendar. The event successfully achieved its goal of providing fun and enjoyment for all, fostering a sense of community among the students, as well as giving the organisers a taste of entrepreneurial spirit. The event marked the advent of the English Association on the scene and set a benchmark for the students, for future gatherings.

To inculcate a research temperament in the students, the **Annual English Research Seminar 2023-24** was conducted on **26th (Tuesday) and 27th September (Wednesday), 2023** by the English Association of the English Department on the theme 'The Complexity of Good and Evil'. The process and the initiation of the seminar began in July, 2023 when interested participants submitted their abstracts after attending the orientation. The Teacher Mentors from the English faculty were allotted to each participant who mentored the participants throughout their writing process. Drafts were submitted according to the deadlines and after three months, participants proudly presented their research in the AV Room. What was noteworthy was the presentation of research papers by participants on a wide array of topics encompassing the theme. The diverse range of topics reflected the dynamism of the English research field and allowed for engaging conversations that expanded participants'

understanding of the blurring lines between good and evil in literary works throughout the ages. The themes covered in the papers ranged from pop culture to literary analysis, highlighting the breadth and depth of the research being conducted in the English language domain. Some of the paper titles were, 'Exploring The Complexity Of Morality In Riichiro Inagaki And Boichi's Dr. Stone', 'Navigating The Labyrinth Of Motherhood - A Deep Dive Into Complex Mothers', 'Shakuni's Tragic Odyssey: a comparative exploration of his character in relation to the Aristotelian Tragic Hero' and many more. The Principal's speech at the seminar was a moment of inspiration and appreciation for the participants. The Principal, Professor Dr. Dabholkar expressed deep appreciation for the efforts and contributions made by the participants in advancing the field of English research. He emphasised the importance of such seminars in fostering a culture of academic inquiry and the sharing of knowledge. The best five research papers were published in Hwaethwugu 2024, the Annual English Magazine of the English Department. All the participants as well as attendees were provided with certificates for their outstanding contribution in making it a success.

The Novel Room and the Film Room, the two discussion clubs under the aegis of the English Department, conducted events throughout the year, from August till February. The detailed reports of the sessions are presented separately in this Magazine. Both clubs contributed to the academic enrichment of the students and provided them with a safe space for discussing various issues and texts, both literary and cinematic.

Kalki 2023 was a vibrant and inclusive celebration of artistic talent and expression. The Annual English Magazine 'Hwaethwugu' was launched in the fest 'Kalki' as well. The launch of the Magazine was the inaugural event of the Festival. A compendium of original and creative works submitted by students across various disciplines were compiled by the dedicated Magazine team. Two alumni of the Department, who were special invitees for the Launch, Amrita Chakraborty and Aakriti Jadwani, graced the occasion and addressed the students with an inspiring appeal to contribute to the Magazine, as well as shared their individual experience of working on the Magazine. A lot of events were thoughtfully curated to provide students from all over the city with a platform to showcase their creativity in a noncompetitive, judgement-free environment. This approach allowed participants to explore and express their artistic visions without fear of criticism, fostering a sense of freedom and confidence. Indigenous artists were invited as judges, not to rank or critique, but to share their wealth of experience and offer constructive feedback. They were more than happy to engage with the students, offering insights that enriched the participants' understanding of their craft, be it singing, dancing, story-telling, stand-up comedy, debating or painting. For those who seeked quieter moments amidst the excitement, Kalki offered a range of serene spaces as well like 'The Book Nook Corner' is perfect for introverts who want to curl up with a book and escape into another world for a while. These thoughtful touches ensured that Kalki catered to a wide range of preferences, making it a truly inclusive event that has something for everyone. The Annual English Play, a fantastic rendition of the film 'La La Land' by the students, served as the festival's pinnacle. The performance made for an absolutely remarkable experience by encapsulating the spirit of the movie and incorporating original elements that connected with the audience.

The final event was the 'Journalistic Ethics and Fact Checking Workshop' that provided valuable insights into the world of journalism. Journalism today is plagued with clickbait news and the Workshop underscored the need for trustworthy news and headlines as well. Delivered by the Dean of the Indian Institute of Journalism and News Media, **Dr Kanchana** 

Kaur, and Ms Surekha Deepak, a Professor at the same institution, the resource persons both provided a thought provoking journey through the process of articulating any news piece. Through various exercises, they engendered an understanding of the various tools and techniques for fact-checking, including government claims and commercial enterprises. The assignments were given in order to help students learn how to apply the techniques that were taught as well as to test students' understanding of the knowledge. Overall, the workshop was well organised and systematic.

The faculty are always in a quest to develop and better their skills in various domains, and to this end, two of our faculty members undertook online refresher courses. Dr Deepna Rao pursued a Refresher Course on 'Advanced Research Methodology' from October 23 to November 6, 2023 from the Teaching Learning Centre, Ramanujan College, University of Delhi. She also pursued two Faculty Development Programmes, one on 'Effective Grant Writing Strategies Using Al' conducted by Woxsen University and Texas Tech University, and the other on 'Introduction to Digital Humanities' by IIT Jodhpur. Dr Anamika Purohit also pursued a Refresher Course in English from the Teaching Learning Centre, Ramanujan College, University of Delhi. Both faculty members pursued these courses online, while conducting lectures fultime in College. Both members also pursued research and published a paper and chapters in books. Dr Rao had one publication in a UGC-CARE peer-reviewed journal, and two book chapters published; Dr Purohit had one book chapter publication. Both attended and presented papers at international seminars and conferences.

Our Department Faculty have enriched the academic landscape beyond College and have positions in various capacities that help build curricula and/or teach at the Postgraduate level. Ms. June Dias has been a Visiting Faculty and a paper-setter at the Postgraduate sub-centre at Mithibai College (Autonomous). Dr. Seema Sharma is a recognized PhD Guide and is serving as a University of Mumbai, Board of Studies Syllabus Sub-Committee Member for MA Part II on the elective Pandemic Studies and for SYBA Advertising. Dr. Deepna Rao is a Member, Board of Studies Syllabus Sub-committee for TYBA English Paper VIII (University of Mumbai); SYBA Women's Studies (with effect from 2022-23), and for MA Part II Elective IX (B): European Literature in English Translation (with effect from 2022-23). Additionally, she is also a Member of the Syllabus Sub-committee of the University of Mumbai's BOS for the BA-B.Ed course for 'Mass Communication'. All three members serve as Paper Setters for these papers at the University as well. Dr. Anamika Purohit is the Editor of the International Journal of Emotions, Expressions & Dimensions (IJEED) an International Multidisciplinary Double Blind Peer Reviewed Online Journal curated by Kaash Foundation, a registered NGO in Mumbai. Ms. Radhika Rajwani is a Visiting faculty and examiner for MA English at PG sub-centre at Mithibai College (Autonomous).

History helps us to comprehend and appreciate our predecessors better and imbibe their teachings to build a superior future. It acquaints us with a critical understanding and a wider perspective of events around us; it enables us to recognize behavioural patterns of the societies around us and helps to broaden their perception about the World. At Jai Hind College the Department of History achieves this through its teaching-learning methods and organising various activities for students.

The motto of the History Association has been to be "Informative, Innovative and Inquisitive". Through the diverse activities organised by the Department a focus is being laid on the fulfilment of this moto.

The International Relations Program (2023) Certificate Course, held in September 2023, offered participants an in-depth exploration of contemporary global politics and international relations. Organised and coordinated by Dr. Archana Mishra from the Department of History, the program featured renowned scholars and professionals as resource persons from institutions of repute such as ORF Mumbai, Gateway House, Association of Asia Scholars, Free Press Journal and Resource persons from Shiv Nadar University and Symbiosis, Gujarat University and from Consultants from Ministry of Defence.

The course began on September 1st, 2023, with an introduction, followed by the Principal's and HOD Ms Safina's opening remarks. The inaugural lecture, delivered by Prof. Swaran Singh (JNU head of Security Studies, Visiting faculty, University of British Columbia), focused on challenges in contemporary global politics and the historic expansion of BRICS in 2023.

Throughout the program, various experts delved into significant themes. On September 2nd, Mr. Kashish Parpiani (RIL) introduced participants to the theory of international relations and analyzed the evolution of India-US bilateral relations. Sessions on September 4th led by Mr. RN Bhaskar explored India-China relations and the geopolitical implications of the Ukrainian crisis. The program also addressed border relations, maritime security, and regional geopolitics. On September 6th, Ms. Soumya Awasthi discussed India-China border dynamics, while Prof. Atul Bhardwaj analysed 21st-century geopolitics. Further sessions by experts like Admiral Pradeep Chauhan and Dr. Sanjay Bhardwaj expanded on maritime security and India's neighbourhood policy. The course concluded with examinations of international law, nuclear diplomacy and feminist foreign policy. Participants were assessed through quizzes, essays, and video presentations, ensuring a comprehensive understanding of global issues and their multifaceted impacts.

The History Association conducted its annual film screening week called 'Shades' from 14th to 19th August, 2023 with an objective to enable students to analyse the films on historical topics and to critically evaluate the credibility of these films. The films that were screened for the students were Darkest hour, Rang de Basanti, Rama Madhav, All quiet on the western front, Sardar and Rocky IV. The discussions that followed after the screening were interesting as it explored new areas for analysis and research. Students were required to write a review of at least one movie to enable the faculty to understand the student's point of view.

With an objective to develop critical thinking skills among students, to stimulate interdisciplinary discussions, to integrate knowledge from various disciplines and apply it significantly in the contemporary world, to develop creative and innovative skills among students and to encourage interest in research in interdisciplinary projects, The History Department in collaboration with the Philosophy Department organised **Seven Online Interdisciplinary Guest Lecture Series from 2nd September to 18th December, 2023**. Various scholars, academicians and industrial experts deliver interactive lectures through their expertise and experience.

The Department hosted a session on gender sensitization, led by **Men Against Violence and Abuse (MAVA)**, an organization dedicated to engaging boys and men in addressing gender inequality and ending gender-based violence. Mr. Altasmash Khan, MAVA's Project Coordinator, who oversees the Gender-Sensitization and Mentoring Program for college students, was the guest speaker. The session concluded successfully, leaving students with a

deeper understanding of gender norms and inequalities still prevalent today.

The FYBA students were taken to the Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Vastu Sangrahalaya (CSMVS) Museum as part of their curriculum. The museum visit aimed to enhance their understanding of architectural history and cultural preservation. The students were given an insightful tour of the museum's architectural features, including its Indo-Saracenic design, which blends Hindu, Islamic, and European elements. The teacher in charge, Dr Mishra explained how these architectural styles reflected Mumbai's colonial past and cultural amalgamation.

Inside the museum, students explored a wide range of exhibits, from ancient artifacts to contemporary art. Each student had been assigned specific exhibits beforehand, and they delivered presentations on these topics. Their presentations focused on the cultural significance of the objects and their historical relevance. Mudra has been the Annual Intercollegiate History competition of Ruia College and the History Association has been participating regularly in this event. This year's Mudra theme was held on 12th January 2024 and the theme was to explore the legacy of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj. FYBA student Ms Hardika Gupta won the First Prize for the Cinekari event where students had to make cinematic masterpieces through the creation of movie posters, immortalizing the legends of Maratha history's Royal Period. Ms Lakshita Jain won the second prize for the Durgaveer event. For the Quiz Ranangan which was on Maratha History, SYBA students, Yash Jethwa and Yash Meher got the First Prize. The Life Science Department at Jai Hind College is dedicated to fostering a deep understanding of biological sciences, equipping students with the knowledge and skills necessary for careers in research, healthcare, and environmental conservation. Through a blend of rigorous academics and hands-on experience, the department nurtures future leaders in the arena of Life Sciences.

One of the standout moments this year was the introduction of the NEP for first-year students, which kicked off with great enthusiasm. The NEP 2020 is designed to build an education system that is deeply rooted in Indian values while also being globally relevant, preparing a generation of learners to face future challenges with confidence.

The year kicked off with a vibrant Orientation for first-year students, marking an energetic and enthusiastic start for the academic term. In the Department of Life Sciences, second and third-year students warmly welcomed their juniors, setting a positive tone for the new academic journey. The Orientation aimed to equip the students with the knowledge and confidence needed to start their studies successfully and to integrate them smoothly into the academic community.

The Department of Life Sciences offers various AAA courses for their students, and this year's course titled 'Science of Sleep' focused on understanding the concept, process and facets of sleep. It garnered strong interest, with many students from across the Biological Sciences Department enrolling and successfully completing the course.

A series of institutional visits were organised to give students firsthand experience of how research is conducted at national institutes and provide opportunities to interact with research scholars and scientists. On November 30th, 2023, the TY students visited the ACTREC institute during its open day, accompanied by Ms. Kajal Sankhala. Additionally, a field visit was conducted in collaboration with the Botany Department. TY students from both departments visited Go Green nursery as part of their Applied Component curriculum.

A Parent-Teacher meeting for TY students was organised on December 16th, 2023. This meeting allowed parents to gain insights into the subjects and assess their child's academic progress.

The faculty continuously strives to make the curriculum engaging through innovative teaching methods. As part of their Continuous Assessment, TY students showcased a series of documentaries they filmed on important environmental topics. These documentaries were also uploaded on the YouTube channel of the department at the end of the academic year. Besides mind-maps and crosswords, the SY students presented examples of public participation through skits, poems, and raps. Additionally, FY students had the opportunity to display their artistic talents by creatively explaining various concepts using reels and models.

The internships offered by the department are instrumental in shaping the aptitude and professional growth of students. Students from all bioscience departments have the opportunity to participate in summer internships, including a specialised program in the field of In Vitro Fertilization, organised in collaboration with the Embryology Academy for Research & Training (EART). Additionally, another significant internship is provided by REE Labs, focusing on the rapidly advancing field of Stem cells. These internships offer invaluable hands-on experience, equipping students with practical skills and deepening their understanding of cutting-edge scientific research.

In line with our commitment to fostering a robust research culture, every faculty member is actively engaged in guiding a group of Third Year students through an intensive research project during their final semester. This hands-on experience not only enhances the students' analytical and critical thinking skills, but also prepares them for academic and professional challenges ahead.

To further cultivate their research acumen, students are encouraged to showcase their work at various inter and intra-collegiate research meets, such as Avishkar 2023-24, National Science Day

In collaboration with the Botany department, a seminar titled "Sustainable Living: Revisiting the Roots" was held on 6th February, 2024. The seminar focused on educating participants about the principles of sustainability, highlighting strategies to minimize environmental impact, conserve resources, and promote sustainable practices across different sectors. The objective was to inspire practical solutions and encourage a commitment to incorporating sustainability into everyday activities and organizational practices.

The Department of Life Sciences, under the auspices of I.R.I.S, organizes an annual seminar or lecture to keep young minds updated on the latest scientific advancements. This year's seminar, held on **10th February 2024**, focused on the topic 'Forensic Science: Behind Every Crime, There Is a Clue!' and was attended by over 111 students from the Biosciences departments. The lectures were delivered by Ms. Riva Pocha, Ms. Sejal Gupta, Ms. Priya Dedhia, and Ms. Aloki Doshi. Ms. Pocha, Ms. Gupta, and Ms. Doshi are forensic educators at FACTS, while Ms. Dedhia is an IT security analyst and certified ethical hacker.

The Department of Life Sciences takes great pride in its alumni, who are excelling in various fields. To honour their achievements, we launched a new lecture series last year titled 'Humans of JHC – Life Sciences,' aimed at showcasing the experiences and stories of our Life Sciences alumni. Mr. Ahire discussed his MSc project on Hydra, while Ms. Sharma shared insights from her MSc research on Zebrafish. ## **MICROBIOLOGY**

The Department of Microbiology was established in the year 1981 with the option of Microbiology as a major subject at the T.Y. B.Sc level. The B.Sc in Microbiology degree program at Jai Hind College allows students to gain an Introduction to the Microbiology and to explore the specific areas such as Microbial Genetics, Medical Microbiology and Immunology, Microbial Biochemistry and Bioprocess Technology. The main objective of the Department is to impart quality education in the field of Microbiology and to create skilled microbiologists to contribute to the fields of food production, pharmaceuticals, agrochemicals, environment, agriculture and public health research. The Department of Microbiology aims at using Microbial research as a tool for the benefit of mankind.

The Microbiology Department has conducted several activities at departmental level for the skill enhancement of the students as well as staff. The year started with scheduling BOS Meeting on June 30, 2023 with an agenda to revise Semester I and Semester II syllabi as per NEP and Discuss the Evaluation pattern. A student activity of Water analysis of neighbouring societies conducted on August, 10, 2023 during the rainy season as water in the tanks can get contaminated. The SYBSc students performed experiments to test the microbiological quality of water.

This activity helped the students to apply this learning concept to the benefit of the society. The societies in turn appreciated the hard work of the students and were happy to note the quality of the water sample. Another activity conducted by the Department for maintaining a healthy lifestyle is 'Diet Planning and Management' on September 07, 2023. The aim of the activity was to understand the importance of healthy eating habits, and a balanced diet and to learn the concept of constructing meal plans based on the needs of an individual. This was an interactive session planned for students to help students build their own diet charts keeping in mind all the necessities of a balanced diet. Students enjoyed the session where they were able to calculate their caloric intake and plan their own meal based on their daily requirements.

To acquaint the students with the practical knowledge about the wastewater treatment processes. One-day Field Visit to the MCGM water treatment plant was scheduled on September 13, 2023. The activity proved very beneficial to students as they gained a deeper understanding of the concepts related to waste water treatment. They appreciated the opportunity to witness the practical application of water treatment technologies firsthand, which enhanced their comprehension significantly. To enhance industrial skills and boost the students' experience, the Department conducted hands-on training sessions titled as 'Skill Development In Food And Pharma Technology' from October 28 to November 3, 2023, Students learned designing of growth media, executing aseptic techniques and optimising bioreactor conditions. They were also able to examine the fermentation parameters and the quality of the product formed. Students also evaluated and conducted antimicrobial assays and analysed the results using statistical analysis. This year, the students were taken to visit The Advanced Centre for Treatment, Research & Education (ACTREC) on November 30, 2023 to inculcate the inquisitiveness among the students for research and Higher education. Students intricately understood about the in vitro studies carried out in model animals. The experiments that were carried out were observed by the students. Apart from lab knowledge, the students even learnt about the different opportunities and fellowships from the PhD students working in the institution

The Department is actively involved in taking up consultancy services for the MSc and PhD students for completion of their dissertation work. The consultancy offers the institute the opportunity to conduct and expand research in interdisciplinary areas which can lead to new collaborations, grants and publications. The Department actively participated in Science Open Day and Xplore, 2024 organised by the College. A guided tour of the Microbiology Laboratory provided a behind-the-scenes glimpse into the state-of-the-art facilities available at Jai Hind College, fostering interest and curiosity among attendees. This exhibition successfully engaged students in meaningful discussions, encouraging them to consider pursuing careers in microbiology and related fields. Department focuses not just on learning but celebrates learning by organising the Department Fest. The annual fest FESTCHERICHIA' 24 - MICRO APOCALYPSE was conducted on January 06, 2023, aimed to illuminate lesser-known biological science streams, often overshadowed by mainstream career courses. It served as an interdisciplinary platform, drawing participants from colleges across Mumbai. The Departmental Newsletter - MICRO-BULLETIN was also released in this event.

The Department is actively involved in spreading science awareness for which the Science Awareness Program was scheduled on February 8, 2024. It inspires the young minds to take pure science subjects as a career option. It opened the minds of the school students to various fields in Microbiology. As the learning is a continuous process, specialised visits are conducted by the department. A Visit to Breach Candy Hospital Clinical Microbiology Laboratory on March 16, 2024. Students gained a deeper understanding of microbiology testing methodologies, including specimen processing, culture techniques, and culture identification methods. They could understand the general workflow of a clinical microbiology laboratory and a better understanding of the automated equipment and procedures that are commonly employed.

We are proud of our S.Y.B.Sc.student, Ms. Diksha Gurav, & T.Y.B.Sc. student, Ms. Nimisha Rathi and Ms. Anshita Saxena who have been awarded the Sumitomo Scholarship. Not only students, staff are equally active learners to keep pace with fast developing technology. Mrs. Roonal Kataria & Ms. Abhilasha Upadhyay has completed a four weeks long MOOC titled Let us fight AMR: An awareness about antimicrobial resistance organized by Ramnarain Ruia Autonomous College, under the aegis of UNESCO's Open education for better world initiative in May 2023. Mrs. Roonal Kataria has completed one week FDP on developing MOOCs organised by TLC Ramanujan College, University of Delhi, under Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching under the Ministry of Education, from September 26 - October 2, 2023.

Staff is also engaged in research and have publications on record. Mrs. Roonal Kataria published a paper entitled "Development of Flat Lima Beans Pickles Enriched with Spirulina" in International Journal of Trend in Scientific Research and Development and one chapter in the book "Research & Reviews in Microbiology". Mrs. Smita Menon has published 2 research papers in Springer Journal and presented a poster on "Exploring phages as a sustainable approach for waste water treatment in the 4th International Conference on Bacteriophage Research and Antimicrobial resistance on September 28 and 30, 2023.

## **POLITICAL SCIENCE**

The Department of Political Science at Jai Hind College (Empowered, Autonomous) believes in bridging the theories and concepts taught in the classroom, with the myriad ways in which politics plays out in the real world. We recognise the ubiquity of politics in our personal as well as public life and ensure that the curriculum and extra-academic activities are well-adapted to current issues and debates.

The activities and events of the Department are organised by the Political Science Forum, a student-body that works under the overall guidance of the Head of the Department, Dr. Reema Julka. For the year 2023-24, the Forum was composed of a General-Secretary and six Joint-Secretaries heading various departments. The motto of the Forum is 'Expand, Discuss, Express, and Understand.'

A five-part Workshop Series on 'Understanding Contemporary Politics' was held from August 2, 2023 to August 30, 2023, in collaboration with One Future Collective (OFC), a non-profit working for fostering youth leadership and feminist causes. The workshops were conducted by two facilitators from OFC: Ms. Shreya Joshi and Ms. Kuhoo Tiwari. The sessions covered a comprehensive array of topics which included Constitutional and Human Rights, an Introduction to Public Policy, gender justice, climate change, and careers in Public Policy. The attendees were thus provided the basic theoretical tools to actively engage in critical debates in politics and policy.

Students from the Department of Political Science attended a talk on **G20**: **The India Way** delivered by **Dr. Samir Saran** at Sophia College for Women (Autonomous) on **29th August, 2023**. The talk was organised collaboratively by the Departments of Political Science at Jai Hind College, St. Xavier's College (Autonomous) and the International Relations Club of Sophia College for Women. The speaker put forth the perspective of the Global South in calling for a need to meaningfully restructure the multilateral system, to better reflect the current priorities. The role that India's presidency of the G20 could play in facilitating this transition was the keynote of the talk.

On **September 29, 2023**, the Political Science Forum organised the **Youth Parliament** which witnessed the participation of over 50 students in diverse roles and portfolios. Current policy issues of national importance were selected for the segments of the session including the Question Hour, Short-Duration Discussion, Calling Attention Motion, and Legislative Business. The activity enabled the participants, particularly the students studying Legislative Procedure as a skill-enhancement course, to get hands-on-experience with parliamentary procedures and formats and engage in a fruitful and civil exchange of views on pressing issues of the day.

The **Annual Students' Research Seminar** was held on **January 11, 2024**. The theme for this year's seminar was 'Digital Politics: Power, Governance and Participation in the Digital Age'. Participants explored different areas of application of digital technologies in Public Policy as well the challenges arising from the digitisation of political processes. Issues of digital diplomacy, political polarisation on digital media, digital queer activism, and the use of digital tools for reforming the legal system were some of the topics examined by the paper-presenters.

The TYBA batch of the Department of Political Science undertook a Field Visit to Yusuf Meherally Centre, Panvel on March 6, 2024. Yusuf Meherally is a non-profit that seeks to implement Gandhian principles by working in the domains of rural development, vocational training, and sustainable livelihoods. The students witnessed traditional crafts such as pottery, carpentry, organic soap-making being preserved by skilled artisans. The visit enabled them to understand how the concepts of Gandhian thought in their curriculum could be put into practice.

The Political Science Forum brought out the 2023 edition of the Annual Departmental Magazine, Yours Politically. The magazine contains policy briefs and other feature-articles contributed by students on a range of issues, selected research papers presented in the Research Seminar, reports of all the events/activities organised by the Political Science Forum in 2023-24, as well as sections on photography and book-reviews. It has provided a platform for students to add their perceptive inputs to the discourse on political and policy issues.

To ensure upgradation of the curriculum, the Department held the BoS meeting on & 12th April, 2024. With a view to updating with the latest research, trends, innovations, tools and methodologies that can improve teaching and learning, the faculty attended the following webinars.

- The faculty also attended a National Webinar on "Understanding the New NEP Guidelines for Better Implementation" held on March 24, 2023 organized by VPM's R.Z.Shah College of Arts, Science & Commerce, Mulund (E) and IQAC Cluster.

Thus, the Department of Political Science and the Political Science Forum enabled students to acquire an enriched understanding of politics through lectures, workshops and other participatory activities. The Department shall continue with the same vigour and enthusiasm to enhance the academic knowledge of our faculty and students.



## **PSYCHOLOGY**

Head of Department: Ms. N.K. Jyothi Members: Dr. Ruchi Dubey Chaturvedi, Dr. Freyana Shinde

The Psychology Department has had a dynamic and successful year in implementing activities in our Department. It was marked by a variety of activities that engaged both the mind and the heart. From insightful guest lectures and interactive workshops to hands-on research projects and community outreach.

The Certificate Course for Life Skills (CCLS) conducted from July to August 2023 is an insightful and intellectually stimulating course conducted by the psychology department of Jai Hind College. The objective was to enlighten students beyond their usual curriculum and give an enlightening understanding on basic life skills such as decision making, coping mechanism and management skills.

Our Annual Psychology festival 'Psyc Insight' which was held on September 3 and 4, 2023, aimed to create an environment of fun filled learning with games such as creating a business idea, treasure hunt based on psychological clues and to enhance psychological knowledge. Appreciating different schools of thought of Psychology, different perspectives, Psychologist's viewpoints, psychology based therapies and different countries perspectives regarding mental health.

The seminar was conducted on the occasion of 'World Suicide Prevention Day' titled 'Suicide prevention - Creating hope through action' which began with the introduction of the esteemed resource person, Dr. Avinash Desouza. The speaker maintained that every suicide is preventable and that being equipped with the necessary information, people can assist individuals with suicidal ideation to receive vital help from mental health professionals. The speaker also stated that individuals who receive training via the Gatekeeping Program are instructed in a scientific manner which equips them to be of assistance to individuals with suicidal tendencies by introduction to a mental health practitioner, thus, saving a life. Individuals with suicidal tendencies require hope and reassurance. These trained individuals are expected to make them realise that suicide is not a solution to the problem and there is hope to solve the problem they are faced with. The speaker also stressed upon the fact that post identification of individual with suicidal ideation (SI), it is important to be an active listener as these individuals require a patient, non-judgemental ear. He recommended that these individuals should be accompanied most of the time. A "no suicide pact" was another recommendation made by the speaker, where individuals with SI are to contact the trained person when feeling suicidal, and under no circumstances make a suicidal attempt.

The next was the Certificate Course for Research Methodology (CCRM), held in the months of January and February 2024. The objective was to enlighten students beyond their usual curriculum and give them a brief but profound glimpse into the usage of softwares for research methodology. The curriculum for each of the levels included basics of research and report writing, qualitative analysis tools and quantitative analysis tools with respect to JASP and Excel.

A research Convention for our TYBA psychology major students, 'Manthan' was held on February 8,9, and 10, 2024. The primary objectives included exploring cutting-edge research methodologies, novel psychological phenomena, ground-breaking findings, replicating and testing classical concepts and experiments of psychology and fostering a deeper understanding of the complex interplay of various psychological variables to push the boundaries of human understanding,

A psychoeducational program was conducted on 'Stress and its Management' by the SYBA students from Psychology of Adjustment (POA) from January to February, 2024, for the youth who belonged to a non-psychology background. The workshop began with a quick round of 'Would You Rather' to break the ice with the participants and to make them feel comfortable. The workshop then progressed wherein the volunteers went on to discuss what Stress is and different types of Stress with the aim of making it relatable and very easy to comprehend.

In order to make the participants aware of different factors and reasons that causes stress we performed two brief rounds of Rapid Fire wherein they were asked some trivia questions on pop culture and general knowledge followed by a quick explanation and discussion on various causes of stress ranging from Daily hassles to Catastrophic events. The workshop then adeptly transitioned into the end with complete focus on participants with activities like Charades and 4-7-8 breathing exercises with an aim to help the participants tune in with their stressors.

Various webinars and seminars were conducted for our students to enhance their knowledge in the field of psychology. Empower X – Campus to Corporate - EmpowerX, a FriendsSquare CSR initiative, focuses on empowering university students with essential soft skills—networking, communication, and accountability—vital for success in the corporate world. The workshop was conducted in January 29th, 2024. Through workshops and mentorship, the program equips students with practical knowledge and mental resilience. By bridging the gap between academia and industry demands, EmpowerX aims to cultivate well-rounded professionals ready to excel in diverse corporate environments. The seminar was conducted for the TYBA Psychology major students and was very fruitful in making students understand the importance a LinkedIn profile has to build a strong resume. The speaker showed us the fine intricacies of the application and how we can start building a professional profile. The presentation for these instructions was done in a structured, seamless and meaningful manner. The session helped in clearing all our doubts and it will definitely be detrimental in the future

The webinar, 'PG courses and career options in Psychology' featured a panel of distinguished speakers including professors, researchers, clinical practitioners, psychology professionals, and notable alumni. This webinar was conducted on February 28, 2024. Each speaker was an expert in their respective fields, providing comprehensive information on postgraduate courses offered by various institutions such as Delhi University, St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Christ University, Manipal Academy of Higher Education, Mithibhai College, K.C. College, SNDT Women's University, IIT Gandhinagar, Amity University, Ashoka University, and TISS.A wide range of psychology courses were discussed during the webinar, including clinical, counseling, industrial, and cognitive neuroscience. The speakers elaborated on the eligibility criteria, admission process, and course structure of each program. Additionally, they highlighted any changes brought about by the New Education Policy within the course curriculum.

TYBA psychology majors, under the guidance of Dr. Ruchi Dubey Chaturvedi and Dr. Freyana Shinde, have made significant contributions to the field of psychology through their research presentations and publications in peer-reviewed journals. Their work spans a diverse range of psychological dimensions, including the impact of artificial intelligence in education, where they explore the intersection of technology and learning processes. Additionally, their research on parenting styles delves into how different approaches affect child development and well-being. Another research focuses on the crucial area of women's mental health, specifically examining the psychological challenges faced during menopause. These collaborative efforts have not only enhanced academic understanding but also contributed valuable insights to ongoing discussions in these critical areas of psychology.

'Basics of Excel' was a webinar delivered by alumni Mr. Soochit Bhatt. The session aimed to familiarize students with Microsoft Excel, emphasizing its utility in statistical analysis and research data management. The workshop was attended by 41 students, all of whom are budding psychology professionals keen on enhancing their technical skills. The workshop commenced with an overview of Excel's interface, followed by a demonstration of basic functions such as data entry, sorting, and filtering. Students were introduced to essential statistical functions, including mean, median, standard deviation, and how to use Excel for creating descriptive statistics. The facilitator also covered the application of Excel in data visualization, teaching students how to generate histograms, pie charts, and scatter plots, which are crucial for presenting research findings effectively.

Practical exercises were integrated into the workshop, allowing students to apply what they had learned by working with sample datasets. This hands-on experience was invaluable in reinforcing their understanding of Excel's capabilities in handling research data. The workshop concluded with a discussion on the importance of Excel in conducting psychological research, data interpretation, and report writing.

Our faculty members contribute to the academic community, professional bodies and subject-related disciplines. Ms. N. K. Jyothi was a part of SVT College of Home Science. Dr. Ruchi Dubey Chaturvedi VC Nominee at NK College, Malad; NM College of Commerce and Economics, SVKM, Vile Parle and was a BOS Member inducted in KC College, Churchgate; a subject expert in the BOS of K J Somaiya College, Vidya Vihar, and the Department of Applied Psychology and Counseling Center, University of Mumbai.

As we conclude another successful year, our vision for the Psychology Department remains rooted in fostering an environment of intellectual curiosity, innovation, and practical application. Our activities this year have not only expanded our students' knowledge but also empowered them to apply psychological principles in real-world contexts, from community outreach programs to interdisciplinary research initiatives.

The BVOC Travel and Tourism Management Department prepares students for careers in travel, tourism, hospitality, and entrepreneurship with a comprehensive curriculum. The Department upheld educational standards through workshops, webinars, and expert guest lectures. These sessions covered practical insights into industry trends, including destination training and tourism investment strategies. By emphasizing real-world applications, the department ensures students are competitive and ready for a successful career in travel and tourism.

The Department organized a series of webinars and workshops to keep students informed and active. These events included Destination Training: New Zealand on August 9, 2023, the Study in New Zealand & Switzerland Fair on September 9, 2023, and a session on Sports Tourism by Mr. Shashank Mishra on 11-08-2023. Additionally, there was a webinar on Good Practices in Tourism Investment scheduled for September 25, 2023, an Infographics Workshop by Mr. Tarun Paul on December 9, 2023, and a session on LinkedIn for Professional Use led by Mr. Rushikesh Pandit on February 14, 2024. Mr. R. Venkatesh's workshop, "Creating Heritage Experiences," introduced key elements for designing enriching heritage experiences using Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Terminus (CSMT) as a case study. Mr. Mani Mahesh Aurora's workshop on "Returning to Green Future" focused on sustainability and grassroots investments in Indian tourism.

The BVoc Travel and Tourism Management Department organized a Cruise Tourism Certificate Course from August 30 to September 15, 2023, along with a visit to Cordelia Cruises on October 9, 2023. The course aimed to prepare students for careers in the rapidly growing cruise industry, which is seeing immense growth potential, particularly in India. Key topics included cruise geography, types of ships, itinerary planning, sales and marketing, and non-technical career opportunities. Students also gained insights into health and safety protocols on board and event management. The department collaborated with Cordelia Cruises and industry experts, providing students with valuable exposure and knowledge needed for success in the global cruise industry. A Visit to Cordelia Cruise for 32 students on 9 October 2023 at Alexandra Docks, Mumbai. Students toured key areas such as the restaurant, theatre, gaming arcade, casino, and the ship's bridge, gaining insights into cruise operations. They learned about job roles in areas like hospitality and spa management, along with

the technical aspects of sailing. The visit concluded with a Q&A session with the CEO and other officials, where students explored career opportunities and sustainable practices in the cruise industry.

The BVOC Travel and Tourism Management Department celebrated World Tourism Day 2023 on September 27th with an Industry Symposium centered on the UNWTO theme "Tourism and Green Investments." The symposium highlighted the importance of targeted investments in people, the planet, and prosperity for tourism's recovery and growth.

Ms. Rupinder Brar, IRS, the Chief Guest and Keynote Speaker, emphasized tourism's significant contribution to India's GDP and employment. She outlined the UNWTO's focus on investments in education, sustainable infrastructure, and innovation. The event also recommended enhancing the Jai Hind College YUVA Tourism Club and aligning with the G20 'Goa Roadmap for Tourism,' which prioritizes green tourism, digitalization, skills, MSMEs, and destination management.



The initiative helps students engage with real-world challenges and fosters leadership, teamwork, and a spirit of community service. The projects undertaken have tackled a wide range of issues including education, waste management and women's empowerment. It's a unique opportunity that has enriched our academic and personal growth.

#### **TECH SHIKSHA**

An initiative which was started with the objective of providing basic education to the underprivileged children through the online medium during COVID has been continued and is now a part of the offline mode of teaching focusing primarily on the need of bridging the gap between their reality and a future filled with opportunity.

In the year 2023-24, Tech Shiksha strived to create that world for the underprivileged children of Mumbai, especially those in Dharavi. By recognizing the number of children whose needs are uncatered to, concentrating in the slum areas with a population of 300,000 it provides an opportunity and interacts with 100 of these children with an aim to improve their lifestyle and providing education and other activities for their overall development.

As a part of this project we collaborated with the Community Outreach Programme (CORP) and taught the children at the Gulalwadi Hindi BMC School. We successfully targeted around 100 students with the age ranging from 5-15 with 30+ volunteers who helped the children in every way and taught them fundamentals of english, math and also engaged in extra curriculars like arts, craft and dance. The main goals achieved was that of holistic development which helps in nurturing a well-rounded skillset that goes beyond academics, fostering creativity and emotional intelligence and confidence building which was attained through interactive sessions and positive reinforcement to empower children to believe in themselves and their abilities

and become individuals who can stand up for themselves in the world.

Another benefit that was accomplished was the focus on critical thinking which was developed through the sessions we had with the children wherein they had to take part in interpersonal projects and problem solving exercises designed to make them think outside the box and come up with creative solutions.

The primary focus of IQAC in the academic session 2023-24 was geared towards documentation and compilation of data for the 4th cycle of NAAC Accreditation process. The task was mammoth in proportion as the data encompassed the previous 5 years from 2018-219 to 2022-23. To facilitate the process, a separate NAAC SSR team was formed wherein each quantitative query was assigned to a specific faculty. This ensured a targeted approach with faster results and greater accuracy. The team members were assigned a deadline to complete the task. In addition, a core committee was created with a dedicated responsibility to verify the documents collected. As the entire submission process was online, a technical team was also formed to upload the data and create the requisite links for additional data. All this was closely coordinated with the Website Committee as a lot of the data required to be uploaded on the College portal.

The NEP was successfully implemented in accordance with the curricular framework of the college for the first year of undergraduate and postgraduate programs. The Board of Studies meetings were subsequently held for the implementation of NEP in the 2nd year of all programs for the academic session 2024-25. Feedback was also collected from all students as well as faculty to understand lacunae, if any, in the 1st year of implementation. This feedback was then analyzed with academic peers at the BOS meetings and suggestions incorporated in the 2nd year.

As part of the 'Best Practice' of the institution, the green initiatives of the college were further expanded in the creation of a vertical garden, a vigorous Waste Segregation Drive and a 'No plastic' initiative. Seminars, talks, workshops were conducted for this purpose under the aegis of the newly formed 'Green Club'. Water conservation was another area which was focused upon to create awareness amongst students as also the neighboring community.

A new industry-oriented program with greater focus towards employability driven skill

development, Bachelors of Commerce in Digital Strategy was designed in the NEP format. This program was launched based on the specific requirements of the students. The Board of Studies for the program was constituted and the necessary permissions obtained from the affiliating University so as to enable the launch of the program from 2024-25 academic session.

To update resources with easy access to satisfy the intellectual needs of the students has always been one of the top objectives of the library. Activities for the year were designed in alignment with the above objective.

The Library organized multiple Awareness Programs on the Access to e-Resources under N-LIST and Swayam, Orientation programs on library resources and E- services, and a Special Induction program for the newly appointed staff members. To promote information on awareness of the library activities and new facilities, the library uses a Telegram group named "JHC Library Updates". Jai Hind College Library website is updated on a regular basis to provide latest information to students. Students are encouraged to use "My Info feature" on the online catalog. These helped students to send requests for the books they required related to their course, competitive examinations, self interest or fiction. Their involvement in book recommendation enhances library collection and also creates their interest in the library and its activities.

The Library provides access to e- resources through INFLIBNET - NLIST. For this, the library has initiated continuous awareness programs for students and faculty. This has encouraged them to access online e-resources made available related to their course, research or any subject of interest.

The Book for Cause drive was organized on August 18, 2023. The Library collected books donated by library members. These books on various subjects were displayed in the library. This event was a great success as about 195 books were donated to almost 72 students. In order to encourage students to read books on various subjects, the library organized Theme based book displays on various days such as International Yoga Day, Marathi Bhasha Gaurav Din, Chatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Jayanti, Hindi Diwas etc. Theme included

topics such as Reference sources, Travel and tourism, Ramayan, Read Japan, India. This practice helps students be aware of library collections on a wide range of subjects. Student's response to these book displays was overwhelming. In addition, subscribed Journals and magazines were displayed streamwise for arts, commerce and science subjects.

Virtual book displays a special collection of open access e- books on topics such as Gandhian Literature: Repository of the rich Gandhian knowledge, Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam was made available on the library website. Additionally, during as well as post the pandemic time special efforts were made to select and display books related to themes such as Pandemic histories, Self improvement, Gentle reads, Upbeat and hopeful. These e books were made accessible to students and faculty by providing download links on the Library Website.

Digital Ink, presently an intercollegiate competition, although purely digital in nature, was started way back in 2013 by our library. This has continued till date and has helped to provide a platform to the students to share their writing skills in the form of poetry. Zunaira Khan, Mosaddeka Mallick and Ayur Rode won the prizes in poetry competition. To encourage students participation in this event, winning stories and poems are published in the College Magazine 'Saraswati'. The winner also gets digital certificates for their work.

Library provides a DrillBit Anti-Plagiarism software facility to its members. Teaching Staff members and Research students took advantage of this facility.

Jai Hind College Library also provides a learning platform to the future librarians. This is done by facilitating Internship training to students enrolled for Masters of the Library and Information Science at SNDT Women's University. The Librarian herself provides this guidance to these students for the entire training period of 200 hrs. This practical exposure provides the interns a better perspective of this profession. This workshop, led by Ira Khan, provided valuable insights into mental health and well-being. From November 21 to 24, 2023 the Contingent participated in Shaan, a festival organized by H.R. College. For the second consecutive year, the Sindhi Circle won the 1st prize, showcasing their continued excellence and dedication. On December 7, 2023 the committee organized 'Jhalak,' a pre-event to the flagship Hojamalo festival, within the campus of Jai Hind College. On the same day, the CL Meet for all participating colleges was conducted, marking a

significant success.

On January 4, 2024 the Global Essay writing competition was conducted. The grand event of the year, 'Hojamalo,' was held on January 12 and 13, 2024 marking its 10th edition. Wellness Cell is committed to the well-being of the students and staff of Jai Hind College. With a motto to Listen, Nurture and Support and aim for holistic wellbeing of Jai Hind College along with providing a safe space for every individual to promote mental, emotional, physical, financial and social well-being.

In 2023-24 Wellness cell had a total of 125 members from different streams all over the academic spectrum of Jai Hind College.

The following activities were conducted:

#### 1.Session on Failure

The session on failure took place on 8th August, 2023. It emphasised that setbacks are learning opportunities rather than permanent marks. Five student speakers shared diverse experiences, including career missteps, the pressure to be perfect, struggles with societal beauty standards, and transitions from small towns to big cities. They highlighted how failure can lead to personal growth and resilience. A speaker also discussed overcoming the challenges of high expectations in an army school. Vice President Ashnoor Kaur concluded by reflecting on how sometimes even setbacks can eventually lead to positive outcomes. The session fostered empathy and underscored the importance of kindness towards oneself and others, reinforcing that failure is a temporary bruise rather than a lasting scar.

#### 2. Preventing Suicidal Thoughts Workshop

On September 12, 2023, a workshop on preventing suicidal thoughts was conducted by the Wellness Cell and Sindhi Circle of Jai Hind College, in collaboration with the Agatsu Foundation. Held in the Annexe Building, the workshop focused on breaking the stigma, understanding warning signs, and providing support strategies. Participants engaged in discussions on recognizing suicidal thoughts, supporting those in need, and accessing resources. The session equipped students with practical tools and information on helplines, fostering a supportive environment for addressing and managing suicidal thoughts.

#### 3. Seminar on Wellness: What's That?

On September 16, 2023, the seminar "Wellness: What's That?" provided a platform for exploring personal definitions of wellness. The session featured a circle-based format with participants passing around a box containing thought-provoking questions on various wellness topics. Each pause in music led to discussions on physical activity, self-care, mental health, relationships, work-life balance, and digital well-being. The event successfully fostered a safe space for students to share diverse perspectives and insights. Key outcomes included recognizing the multifaceted nature of wellness, emphasizing self-care, managing stress, understanding the impact of relationships, and promoting mental health awareness amongst Gen Z.

#### 4. Navigating the Nexus: Substance Abuse and Society

On October 5, 2023, a panel discussion on Substance Abuse was held at Venue 1A. Organised by The Wellness Cell and the NSS unit, it featured Dr. Milan Gada, a Tobacco Deaddiction Specialist, and Mr. Bosco Michael D'Souza, an Addiction Treatment Consultant. Dr. Gada addressed tobacco and alcohol addiction, while Mr. D'Souza shared personal anecdotes and insights from his 31 years of experience. The event, which also included an address from Principal Sir on the societal impact of substance abuse, was engaging and impactful, leaving a lasting impression on students.

#### 5. Men's Mental Health Seminar

On December 1, 2023, a Men's Mental Health Seminar was held to raise awareness and commemorate Men's Day. The event featured an open discussion on men's mental health, followed by the screening of the film/documentary 'The Voices of Men,' highlighting the impact of anxiety and depression. Attendees engaged in discussions about stigma and participated in a creative activity addressing social stigma and solutions. The seminar concluded with the distribution of uplifting notes to promote a positive outlook. The event provided valuable insights into societal attitudes and emphasised the need for open discussions on men's mental health.

#### Career series-

On December 13, 2023, Rishabh Singh, a LinkedIn expert with over 60,000 followers, led a

webinar on resume building, interview skills, leadership, and team building, attended by 80+ students. A 2-time TEDx speaker, Rishabh shared insights from his experiences with volunteering, organizing TEDx Juhu, and internships. He emphasized the importance of confidence, effective communication, and networking. He also explained how AI now plays a crucial role in resume selection, making it vital to craft a strong resume. The session concluded with a group activity where participants identified key qualities essential for successful leadership

#### **Academic Series-**

On December 18, 2023, Husna Vanjara, a clinical psychologist and psychotherapist with 27 years of experience, conducted a seminar on exam anxiety, which was attended by over 80 students. Specializing in anxiety disorders, depression, and personal disorders, she utilizes therapies like CBT, REBT, ACT, and Client-Centered Therapy. The seminar addressed the causes and symptoms of exam anxiety, offering practical strategies to manage stress. The speaker emphasized the distinction between normal exam nerves and more severe anxiety. The session concluded with an interactive Q&A, where students received personalized guidance and coping techniques for dealing with academic pressure.

#### **Financial Literacy Series**

From January 10-12, 2024, a 3 session series of financial literacy series aimed to equip college students with essential financial knowledge for lifelong success.

Session 1: Mr Pravin Dongare, a financial expert, introduced key concepts such as inflation, budgeting, emergency funds, and investment basics, including stocks, bonds, and mutual funds.

Session 2: Ms Nita Menezes, a seasoned financial coach, provided insights on budgeting, investments, and strategic decision-making, featuring the 'Financially Smart' and 'Moneyprastha.com' platforms for wealth management.

Session 3: Urmila K. Singh, a certified financial planner, covered investment fundamentals, savings strategies, and various investment options, complemented by a discussion on the film "One Idiot."

All sessions enhanced students' financial literacy, empowering them with practical tools and renewed confidence for managing their financial futures.

#### **VALEO: WELLNESS CELL 23-24 FEST**

The Wellness Cell at Jai Hind College, dedicated to fostering Jai Hind students' well-being, successfully hosted its inaugural festival, 'Valeo,' on February 6th and 7th, blending Bollywood and Wellness themes. The Women's Development Cell (WDC), Jai Hind College, has over the years, held several programs to create awareness amongst the youth about the ills plaguing the women in our society. The objectives of the Women's Development Cell include gender sensitization; healthcare; empowerment; the education of the girls through community interface; social awareness, and exploring entrepreneurship opportunities. Jai Hind has a very strong participation in events of the WDC, and our students are passionate about causes related to women's development and gender sensitization. This year, we took up the theme of 'Beauty Within' and considered the Beauty Industry and its influence on society at large.

Our Inaugural event was a guest lecture on "Ethics of the Beauty Industry" delivered by our alumna Nidhi Lulla on August 4, 2023. The objective of the guest lecture was to critically examine the ethical challenges within the beauty industry, focusing on issues such as consumerism, body image, and sustainability, while encouraging students to reflect on their roles as both consumers and future professionals in this field. Ms. Lulla, a seasoned expert in the beauty and fashion industry, provided the students with an in-depth analysis of the ethical dilemmas that are prevalent in the beauty sector today.

The session began with an overview of the beauty industry's evolution, highlighting how cultural and societal standards of beauty have shifted over time. Ms. Lulla then delved into the ethical concerns associated with these changes, such as the impact of advertising on body image, the exploitation of workers in production chains, and the environmental consequences of beauty products. Ms. Lulla also addressed the concept of "ethical consumerism," emphasising the importance of making informed choices about the products we use and the brands we support. She shared insights on the growing trend of sustainable and cruelty-free beauty, encouraging students to think critically about their purchasing decisions and the broader impact of the beauty industry on society and the environment. The lecture was interactive, with students posing questions and engaging in discussions about their own experiences and observations. Ms. Lulla's expertise and passion for ethical practices in the beauty industry were evident, making the session both informative and thought-provoking.

The next event was a Symposium on 'Critical Issues Affecting Women' on August 31, 2023. The symposium aimed to explore and address critical issues affecting women in society, covering topics such as online safety, health, and gender identity. The event sought to educate and empower students by providing them with knowledge and practical tools to navigate these challenges. The event began with a registration session, followed by the screening of the short film "Juice." The film sparked a lively discussion among the participants, who engaged in a dialogue about the portrayal of gender roles and societal expectations in the movie.

Following the discussion, students performed a skit and songs that highlighted various issues faced by women in society, ranging from domestic challenges to broader social inequalities. The performances were well-received and set the tone for the subsequent sessions.

The first lecture was delivered by **Advocate Prashant Mali**, who focused on the topic **"Safe Cyber Spaces for Women."** He provided valuable insights into the legal frameworks and practical measures that women can adopt to protect themselves online. His lecture was both informative and empowering, addressing concerns about privacy, cyberbullying, and digital harassment.

Next, Ms. Karishma Chawla, a renowned nutritionist, spoke on "Diet and Lifestyle for Women." She emphasised the importance of a balanced diet and regular exercise, particularly in relation to women's health issues. Her session was highly practical, offering students actionable tips on how to maintain a healthy lifestyle amidst their busy schedules.

The final session was an interactive workshop conducted by **Ms. Aekta Khubchandani**, titled **"Mapping Gender Across The Spectrum."** Ms. Khubchandani facilitated a discussion on gender identity and expression, encouraging students to reflect on the complexities of gender beyond traditional binaries. The session was thought-provoking and fostered an inclusive environment where students could share their perspectives and experiences.

The WDC of Jai Hind College celebrates the birth anniversary of Savitri Bai Pule, 3rd January as Nari Mukti Divas and a variety of activities are organised. Mrs Safina Rakhangi who was attending the NSS camp of the college at Vajreshwari, organised a NAARI-depiction of the most influential woman in my life. A few NSS volunteers who were also members of WDC actively expressed their views and stories, deliberating the struggles made by women while playing the role of a mother, a sister, a daughter, a wife and a teacher in order to spread happiness, make others comfortable and enable them to achieve their goals. Many students became emotional and started to introspect how reciprocal they have been to the love, empathy and concern showered by these women. Ms. Simmin Bawa organised a discussion in the FYBA class on "Breaking Barriers, Building Futures" which covered the areas of Women in Leadership, Gender Equality in Education, Breaking Stereotypes and finally Women's Health and Wellbeing.

The International Women's Day coincides with the birth of the Revolutionary Poet of the Women and Working masses; Sahir Ludhianvi who was born in 1921. To mark the International Women's Day, the Women's Development Cell organised an Online discussion on Sahir Ludhianvi as Hindi cinema's only and truly feminist poet. Through his verses written for 122 movies and 550 popular songs for Hindi Films, he kept the Hindi Film Industry (Bollywood) spellbound with his magical verse. A humble attempt was made to understand the unparalleled and all-round creativity of Shair Ludhianvi. The following five songs were screened to understand his works that encouraged the youth of his times,

intellectuals and social activists and also exercised similar influence on the present generation of music lovers and listeners:

- 'Aurat ne janam diya mardo ko' (Sadhana, 1953)
- 'Jinhe naza hai Hind pe' (Pyaasa, 1957)
- 'Tu mere pyaar ka phool hai ki meri bhool hai' (Dhool Ka Phool, 1959)
- 'Tere bachpann ko jawaani ki dua deti hoon' (Mujhe Jeene Do, 1963)
- 'Tu mere saath rahega munney' (Trishul, 1978)

Students tried to review and explore as the songs were screened and later discussed the spark fire of revolt, the social commentary and the typical male attitude of considering women inferior in his earlier poems, at the same time the clichéd nurturing attitude of women reflected in various songs. It was a befitting way to pay tribute to this legendary poet who was concerned about gender oppression and emancipation from patriarchal repression.

As always, the members of the Women's Development Cell ensured gender sensitization, and discussions and debates about issues concerning Women's Development in the classroom. Ms. Safina Rakhangi and Dr Deepna Rao, through the Foundation Course classes, highlighted a number of issues related to Women's Development such as the Constitutional Rights and Safeguards of Women, Ecofeminism and Women's Education. Students also had the screening of films and documentaries related to women's issues in the Foundation Course lectures. Ms. Simmin Bawa also has taught units related to gender as well as feminism. Thus, the Women's Development Cell achieved its objectives both inside and outside the classroom. Members have also been actively attending online national and international events related to gender issues. The staff and student members hope to return with renewed vigour next year and continue in this noble mission of fostering women's development.

# THE NOVEL ROOM (UNDER THE AEGIS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH)

The Novel Room is an affiliated Discussion Club of the English Association, and its ebullient spaces invite and engage just about anyone and everyone with a curious mind and a talkative temperament. The team in charge of curating the Novel Room sessions has one intention: to be as interactive and interlocutory as possible and give the audiences the literary experiences of a lifetime. Its core activities involve the discovery, exploration, interpretation and analysis of the literary genre as a whole. The Novel Room is dedicated to curating and conducting student-friendly sessions that aid in holistic development.

The Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) introduced the New Education Policy (NEP) in 2020, calling for imaginative and flexible co-curricular activities to be included into Degree Courses for students. Co-curricular Courses (CC) can be obtained via multiple activities such as Health and Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, Fine/Applied/Performing Arts, Cultural Activities, etc. at the convenience, preference, and

necessity of the students. The Novel Room conducts sessions that fall under the Cultural and Extra-curricular level.

#### **Learning (Expected) Objectives of Novel Room:**

- To foster learning beyond traditional literature and inculcate critical thinking in students beyond classroom learning.
- To encourage public speaking and develop communication skills among students.
- To familiarise students of varying courses with the broad scope of literature and its relevance in society and daily life.
- To encourage healthy and regular reading among students.
- To promote research and analysis through deep cultural, political, psychological, historical and social discussions relevant in the context of literature.
- To develop vocabulary, reading, writing, listening and speaking skills of students through various tasks and activities assigned to them in every session.
- To facilitate imaginative and flexible interactions in regard to literature that align with the New Education Policy (NEP).

#### Duration and Frequency:

The Novel Room conducts 10 sessions throughout the year. These include bi-monthly sessions, each being around 2-3 hours.

The Novel Room organised 10 events in the Academic Year 2023-24, ranging between 2-3 hours per session. Each session also included an additional assignment that had to be submitted by each participant.

### Event I / Inaugatory Session – "Animated Characters: From Monochrome to Technicolor"

The Inaugatory Event of the Novel Room was in collaboration with the Film Room, inculcating one of the most popular, student-friendly topics—comic and graphic novels in literature. Students were exposed to various discussion topics such as the Historical Evolution of Comics, Popularization of Queer Identity, the narrative of good v/s evil, the contribution of Indian Comics to Literature, and the mention of popular graphic novels of Barbie and Dragon Ball Z. The session was also marked by Film Room screenings of multiple nostalgic media.

#### Event II: "To the Reader, For the Readers: Storytelling through Epistolaries"

The second session of the novel room revolved around the concept of epistolaries and dove deep into the evolution, adaptations and significance of epistolaries in literature. From the history to modern digital use of letters with emphasis on romance and poetry, the participants were engaged in various in-depth discussions about the same. Further, the limitations and shortcomings of epistolaries were discussed and the students were allotted an assignment at the end of the session.

#### **Event III: "Mythologies: From Gods to Gargoyles"**

The third event of the Novel Room was one of the few online events held during the academic year, focusing on mythology as an important aspect of literature. In order to keep the audience engaged, the event was marked with games to keep the minds of the audience fresh. From bringing up the beloved Percy Jackson series to the underrated nature of Indian Mythology and the addition of the discovery of Christian, Norse and Mesopotamian Mythology, the third session of the Novel Room was one of the most well-

received online session, concluding with thoughtful discussion on the influence of mythology in modern-day life.

#### **Event IV: "Symphony of the Pages: Music & Literature"**

The fourth event of the Novel Room was held offline and centred around the theme of music and literature. It was an interactive session where students talked about their favourite artists, analysed the meanings of various lyrics and compared the lyrics used in different languages, and contexts. There was a focus on translations and meanings of lyrics with reference to culture. Students also engaged in a fun translation activity where they had to try to directly translate the given lyrics from one language to another.

#### **Event V: "Twice Upon a Time: Fairy Tales Retold"**

The fifth event of the Novel Room aimed to highlight fairytales from a literary perspective. The audience discussed the common fairy tales they grew up with, to their different adaptations that had arisen as society progressed. From Ethnic Fairytales to the true origins behind the fantastical story of Snow White and the Moral Ambiguity within fairytales, the Novel Room's fifth session was filled with evoking long-buried childhood memories.

#### Event VI: "Reading Between the Miles: A Literary Expedition"

Conducted online, it took travel as a part of literature, discussed in detail along with a variety of topics, such as evolution of one's personality through travel, fantasy travel literature used in books such as TinTin and Geronimo Stilton, travel and culture including immaterial culture such as places created in books that one is aware of but does not exist. The audience resonated with these experiences and could relate with the travel imagery created in these books.

#### Event VII: "The Novel Room x Kalki: The Binary Breaker"

The seventh session of the Novel Room welcomed Abhishek Lamba, one of the long-standing alumnus of Jai Hind College during "Kalki: An Eternal Expression." Deviating from the regular nature of the Novel Room sessions, event seven saw a receptive audience enjoy interactive games challenging 'Mr. Patriarchy' or the traditional notion of gender being thoroughly assigned since birth. Thanks to Abhishek Lamba, the audience were able to engage in games and conversations that made us all put on our creative-thinking caps while encompassing the spirit of being true to oneself.

#### Event VIII: T(EA) Series - Event I

The eighth session of the Novel Room and the first session of the T(EA) Series (wordplay on the company T-Series implying a pun the spilling of "tea" with the EA i.e English Association). Held online, it was one of the most interactive sessions where students could freely express their opinions and debate on controversial topics. Some of these topics were about "cancel culture": whether artists should be cancelled for their unpopular opinions and if that would affect their fanbases; queer interpretations of historical texts, the possibility of misinterpretations of queer characters in the time when it was not as accepted.

#### **Event IX: T(EA) Series - Event II**

Event Nine of the Novel Room was a successor to Event Eight, once again amplifying the platform for free expression without harsh critique. Conversation commenced on separation of art from the artist, on whether it was acceptable to glorify 'good' literature regardless of the background of the author or not. Opinions on the fact that social media heavily warped literature & its fandoms were also put forth, while some argued that social

The session concluded with a humorous and ironic award ceremony for the most unpopular characters, plots and series for categories of which the audience voted upon and decided winners for. The participants were given their final assignment once the session ended.

All in all, each session brought in a special verve of energy, and encapsulated the spirit of curiosity and insight of all participants.

# THE FILM ROOM (UNDER THE AEGIS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH)

In the 2023-24 academic year, the Film Room delivered an outstanding array of cinematic events that captured the imagination and engagement of our members. We kicked off with a dynamic collaboration with the Novel Room, on 'Animated Characters' exploring the fascinating intersection of comic and manga characters with their animated film adaptations, which sparked lively discussions on how animation can reshape audience perception. This session involved a comparative analysis of characters from comics and mangas and their animated film adaptations. Members discussed the portrayal and development of these characters in different media, exploring how animation can enhance or alter the audience's perception.



Our collaboration with the Social and Dramatics Union brought a gripping screening of "12 Angry Men," attended by over 50 people, igniting profound discussions on persuasion, manipulation, and the film's psychological depth. The technical side of filmmaking was illuminated in a workshop covering lenses, screenplay writing, and cinematography, complemented by a fun guessing game of movie posters. The discussion focused on the art of persuasion, the power of manipulation, and the use of arguments. We also delved into the technical aspects of the film and its portrayal of human psychology, examining how these elements contribute to the film's enduring impact.



The next session was an outdoor session at Bake Live Studios, where we studied Film Theory in collaboration with Bake Live Studios. This external event featured an in-depth look into the technical aspects of filmmaking. The session covered various topics, including the different uses of lenses, screenplay writing methods, and the evolution of cinematography. Participants also engaged in a game of guessing movies through posters, which provided a fun and interactive way to test their creativity.



During the festive season, we celebrated with a screening of the beloved Christmas classic "Home Alone." The event included a discussion on the history of Christmas in cinema and the physical techniques used in the film to depict humor. This screening was well-received and sparked a lively conversation among attendees.



The year continued with short film screenings featuring works by Martin Scorsese and Royal Stag directors. This was an online screening of short films, featuring works by renowned directors such as Martin Scorsese's "The Big Shave," and some Royal Stag's masterpieces such as "Café Interior," "Juice," and "Rogan Josh." These screenings provided a platform for analyzing the unique storytelling techniques and thematic elements present in short films.




During the festival of "Kalki" the Film Room hosted an enlightening talk on film archiving by the Film Heritage Foundation. Film Heritage Foundation is a not-for-profit organization dedicated to supporting the conservation, preservation and restoration of Indian cinema. The Foundation came to Jai Hind College on February 2, 2024 and the speakers talked about how films are archived and the importance of archiving classic cinema.



Next, we explored Western art cinema through the screening of "The Banshees of Inishiren." The discussion focused on the minimalist story, in-depth character analysis, and themes of friendship, war, and human psychology. The film's unique approach to storytelling and character development was a highlight for many attendees.

The screening of "Garden of Words" allowed members to delve into themes of lonely sadness, subtle romances, and lingering emotions. The film's beautiful animation and poignant storytelling provided a rich basis for discussion on the emotional depth of animated cinema.

The year concluded with a hands-on filmmaking workshop where members created their own short films, embracing roles from actors to directors. Members took an active role in understanding the filmmaking process by using a prompt to create their own short film. Students participated as actors, writers, cinematographers, and directors. This hands-on experience was invaluable in teaching the practical aspects of film production and fostering teamwork and creativity among members.

Through screenings, discussions, and practical workshops, we have explored a wide range of topics and film genres. # PHYSICS DISCUSSION CLUB (UNDER THE AEGIS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICS)

The Physics Discussion Club holds meetings every Thursday, for one and half hours. The Discussion Club is open to students from all disciplines. The students meet once a week, and one or two of them present a detailed overview, using a PowerPoint presentation, of a research paper or a topic of current research interest. The presentation will include data and graphs and will last approximately 30 minutes. This will be followed by a 10-minute Q&A session, where the speaker's preparation and understanding of the topic will be thoroughly examined. Students will select the topics they wish to present. Participation in the club is limited to interested students, and each member is required to present when it is their turn. In addition to giving presentations, all members are expected to actively participate in the discussions. After the presentations and discussions, students are welcome to share interesting news, ideas, or books they have recently encountered for group discussion.

#### Learning Objectives:

- Promote scientific communication and interaction among FY, SY, and TY students.
- Raise awareness of ongoing research activities worldwide.
- Make the concepts and equations from the curriculum more engaging and relatable by highlighting their real-world physical significance, moving beyond abstract mathematics.
- Provide training on effectively extracting valuable information from research papers.
- Encourage students to brainstorm and identify new research problems for future exploration.

- Improved ability to communicate physics related topics to both technical and popular audiences.
- Confidence in using ICT tools and scientific software.
- Ability to think and select topics for research.
- Participation in conferences/workshops/research meets.
